Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Families, together with Mrs. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Mrs. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the “Semaine des services éducatifs en CPE et milieu familial”, held from 26 May to 1 June 2019;

THAT, on this occasion, the Assembly underline the expertise and the kindness that the staff of educational childcare services show daily in their work with children;

THAT the Assembly express its gratitude to these people who care deeply about the well-being of children and who do their utmost to provide them with a friendly and stimulating environment;

THAT it recall that, consequently, all projects that may have an environmental impact, in particular projects involving the transport of petroleum products, are subject to Québec's environmental impact assessment and review procedure;

THAT it also recall that such projects cannot proceed without the agreement of the Québec Government;

THAT, lastly, it recognize that the British Columbia Government has full legitimacy to appeal the BC Court of Appeal's decision on the application of its environmental law.

Report Stage

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 14 May 2019, on consideration of the report from the Committee on Culture and Education on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 12, An Act to clarify the scope of the right to free education and to allow the regulation of certain financial contributions that may be required, together with the amendments transmitted by Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) and Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the amendment by Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions on the amendments moved by Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) and Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke) and on the report from the Committee on Culture and Education were deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

- the second, on a question from Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) to Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, about the CAQ Government's improvisation with regard to pre-kindergarten; Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Families, replaced the Minister for this debate;
- the third, on a question from Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) to Mrs. LeBel, Minister of Justice, about the Minister's silence on the contradiction between Bill 21 and the *Act respecting equal access to employment in public bodies*.
