The Assembly was called to order at 1.41 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 3 June 2019, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Immigration, Diversity and Inclusiveness, that Bill 21, An Act respecting the laicity of the State, do now pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 21 was passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 21 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

After consultation with the Opposition parties and the independent Members, Mr. Legault, Premier, moved the following:

THAT, in accordance with sections 106 and 107 of the *Public Service Act* (chapter F-3.1.1), Me Nour Dalah be reappointed a member of the Commission de la fonction publique, for a three-year term effective 4 August 2019.

The question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was taken as required under section 106 of the *Public Service Act*.

After consultation with the Opposition parties and the independent Members, Mr. Legault, Premier, moved the following:

THAT, in accordance with sections 58 and 58.3 of the *Charter of human rights and freedoms* (chapter C-12), Me Suzanne Arpin, Chief Counsel and spokesperson, Commission d'enquête sur les relations entre les Autochtones et certains services publics, be appointed a member and Vice-President of the Commission des droits de la personne et des droits de la jeunesse, for a five-year term, effective 10 June 2019.

The question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was taken as required under section 58 of the *Charter of human rights and freedoms*.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT, on this day, the National Assembly recognize the work done by the 8,700 home care workers providing at-home assistance in Québec, the vast majority of whom are women;

THAT it highlight the important contribution of social economy enterprises specializing in home care services in the delivery of services in Québec, as evidenced by the 6 million hours provided to 100,000 users each year;

THAT it applaud the active role played by home care workers to satisfy the desire of a growing number of people with loss of autonomy to stay at home.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), together with Mr. Carmant, Minister for Health and Social Services, Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline Québec Week for the Disabled, held from 1 to 7 June 2019 under the theme "Together, let's build a more inclusive society"; THAT, on this occasion, it raise public awareness to the obstacles that persons with disabilities may face;

THAT it remind the Government that it has a duty to take into account the recommendations of the groups that represent the disabled and ensure the protection of their rights in the development of its government policies;

THAT it recall that the various associations deplore that the offering and quality of paratransit services vary and are not equal across Québec;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to amend Bill 17 to ensure that access to paratransit services is sufficient in all regions of Québec.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), together with Mr. Boulet, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, Mr. Rousselle (Vimont), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the first ever Semaine nationale des couvreurs du Québec (National Roofers Week), launched on 2 June 2019 under the theme "Human Enterprises";

THAT the National Assembly express its thanks for the work accomplished and the community involvement of over 5,700 Québec workers spread among 1,000 roofing employers who contribute daily to our economy and job creation;

THAT it recognize the importance of Québec's roofing industry, which annually generates a \$1 billion turnover, ranking eighth in importance among the 25 construction trades;

THAT the National Assembly take this opportunity to highlight the Association des maîtres couvreurs du Québec's initiative of setting up the first edition of National Roofers Week at the national level.

THAT the Minister of Public Security be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.
