#### **Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations**

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request from Mrs. St-Pierre (Acadie) to be heard on an alleged breach of privilege.

In her notice, the Member for Acadie alleged that the Government House Leader's remarks during the Wednesday, 18 September 2019 sitting undermined her reputation and integrity and cast doubt on her impartiality as Chair of the Committee on Transportation and the Environment. According to the Member for Acadie, those remarks are contrary to paragraph 5 of Standing Order 35 of the National Assembly.

The Government House Leader's remarks were allegedly made during his arguments regarding the Official Opposition House Leader's request for a directive on social media tweets made by the Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change regarding the report tabled by the Committee on Transportation and the Environment within the framework of the order of initiative on issues relating to recycling and local recovery of glass.

The President took the matter under advisement.

THAT the National Assembly oppose the National Energy Corridor project proposed by the Conservative Party of Canada, which would allow the Federal Government to impose the construction of an oil pipeline on Québec territory, without Québec's consent.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

Mr. Boulet, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, moved that Bill 33, An Act to amend the Labour Code concerning the maintenance of essential services in public services and in the public and parapublic sectors, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 33 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 33 be referred to the Committee on Labour and the Economy for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

#### Passage in Principle

Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved that Bill 28, An Act to allow the establishment of certain health and social services measures related to the Mauricie et Centre-du-Québec health region's special geographic status, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division, and Bill 28 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 28 be referred to the Committee on Health and Social Services for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

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#### Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 19 September 2019, on the motion moved by Mrs. LeBel, Minister of Justice, that Bill 29, An Act to amend the Professional Code and other provisions in particular in the oral health and the applied sciences sectors, do now pass in principle.

#### **Debates upon Adjournment**

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question by Mrs. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) to Mrs. Charest, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, about the Government's refusal to increase the budgets of women's shelters.

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At 6.12 o'clock p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 7.30 o'clock p.m.

#### Passage in Principle

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Mrs. LeBel, Minister of Justice, that Bill 29, An Act to amend the Professional Code and other provisions in particular in the oral health and the applied sciences sectors, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 29 was passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 29 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Carmant, Minister for Health and Social Services, moved the passage of Bill 2, An Act to tighten the regulation of cannabis.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage).
