#### **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

The Premier, after consultation with the Opposition parties and the independent Members, moved:

THAT, pursuant to sections 5 and 5.2 of the *Anti-Corruption Act* (chapter L-6.1), Mr. Frédérick Gaudreau, Acting Anti-Corruption Commissioner, be appointed Anti-Corruption Commissioner for a seven-year term, effective immediately.

The question was put on this motion and, for the purposes of section 5 of the *Anti-Corruption Act*, a recorded division was held thereupon.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 110 Nays: 0 Abstentions: 1

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Mrs. Nichols (Vaudreuil), together with Mrs. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the Sainte-Marthe-sur-le-Lac dike rupture; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mrs. D'Amours, Minister Responsible for Indigenous Affairs, Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the conclusions of the Viens Commission, expressed on 30 September 2019, as regards the responsibility of the Québec State with regard to the overwhelming and painful findings set out in its report;

THAT it recognize, as the leaders of all the political parties represented in the National Assembly have affirmed, the importance of taking concrete actions, now, to put an end to discrimination against the members of the First Nations and the Inuit and to forge egalitarian relations with them;

THAT it acknowledge that the report from the Commission Viens calls on the Québec Government to recognize and implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, a recommendation also made in the report of the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls tabled last May;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec Government to recognize the principles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and commit to negotiating its implementation with the First Nations and the Inuit.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 111 Nays: 0 Abstentions: 0

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Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), together with Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on promoting and protecting the French language; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Guilbault, Minister of Public Security, together with Mrs. Nichols (Vaudreuil), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mrs. Richard (Duplessis) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly officially recognize the "Semaine de la réhabilitation sociale", an initiative of the Association des services de réhabilitation sociale du Québec, to be held from 14 to 18 October 2019;

THAT the Assembly stress the week's importance in fostering a conversation, in the public space, about the issues and values relating to social rehabilitation;

THAT it affirm that social reintegration is the best way to reduce offenders' recidivism and, in doing so, protect the public in the long term; THAT, in this regard, it recognize the essential role played by the Ministère de la Sécurité publique's Correctional Services which, for 50 years, have favoured a reintegration-oriented approach, recognized here and abroad;

THAT it also recognize the valuable contribution of the Association des services de réhabilitation sociale du Québec which, through its 63 community organizations and its two groups, actively participates in offenders' social and community reintegration;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly applaud the efforts of all those who often work in the shadows to support and accompany offenders in their social reintegration, helping them become law-abiding citizens.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

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Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), together with Mrs. Hivon (Joliette), moved a motion on the current federal elections; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT the National Assembly give effect to the order of reference given to the Committee on Public Finance within the framework of the consideration of Bill 38, An Act amending certain Acts establishing public sector pension plans, to hold special consultations and public hearings on 10 October 2019 after Routine Proceedings until 1.00 o'clock p.m. and from 3.00 o'clock p.m. to 6.00 o'clock p.m.;

THAT, for this purpose, the Committee hear the following:

Syndicat de professionnelles et professionnels du gouvernement du Québec

Confédération des syndicats nationaux

Fédération des travailleurs et travailleuses du Québec

Fédération autonome de l'enseignement

THAT a period of 12 minutes be set aside for opening statements, allocated as follows: 6 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 4 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, 1 minute to the Second Opposition Group and 1 minute to the Third Opposition Group;

THAT the presentation by each organization last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 35 minutes, allocated as follows: 17 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 11 minutes 40 seconds to the Official Opposition, 2 minutes 55 seconds to the Second Opposition Group and 2 minutes 55 seconds to the Third Opposition Group;

THAT the Minister Responsible for Government Administration be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

#### **Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly**

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 3 October 2019, on the hoist motion moved by Mr. Derraji (Nelligan) within the framework of the debate on the passage in principle of Bill 34, An Act to simplify the process for establishing electricity distribution rates.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the hoist motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Julien, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, that Bill 34, An Act to simplify the process for establishing electricity distribution rates, do now pass in principle.

#### **Debates upon Adjournment**

- the first, on a question from Mr. Derraji (Nelligan) to Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, about the fact that few immigrants have been selected through the ARRIMA system, while Québec is currently experiencing a labour shortage;
- the second, on a question from Mr. Barrette (La Pinière) to Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Transport, about the need for the CAQ Government to table all studies on the third link, as well as hear the project office director in parliamentary committee;
- the third, on a question from Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides) to Mr. Julien, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, about the need to withdraw Bill 34, An Act to simplify the process for establishing electricity distribution rates.

At 6.38 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

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The proceedings resumed at 7.30 o'clock p.m.
