At the request of the President, Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lacombe, Minister Responsible for the Outaouais Region, together with Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved: THAT the National Assembly recognize the Outaouais as an administrative region with significant differences;

THAT it underscore the fact that these differences result in major challenges given, in particular, the region's location near the border with Ottawa;

THAT it recognize that, in recent years, the Outaouais region has fallen significantly behind with respect to public funding in health, education, higher education and culture;

THAT it recall that this situation has had a far-reaching impact on the region's economic development and its ability to establish its own institutions in many areas of Québec jurisdiction;

THAT, lastly, it underscore the importance of supporting the Outaouais region, including by taking into consideration these significant differences.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

THAT the National Assembly take note that, on 9 October 2019, Turkey launched a military operation against Kurdish positions in northern Syria;

THAT it affirm its solidarity with the Kurdish population, which helped to defeat Daesh in Syria;

THAT it invite the international community to continue to encourage Turkey to work with the parties to find a peaceful solution through dialogue and respect for human rights in order to avoid an escalation in violence.

THAT the National Assembly call for social dialogue in Chile as a means of putting an end to the violence and finding a response to the legitimate demands of the population.

#### **ORDERS OF THE DAY**

#### **Government Bills**

*Passage in principle* 

Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved that Bill 38, An Act amending certain Acts establishing public sector pension plans, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, interrupted the debate to inform the Assembly that he had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 31 October 2019 on a question from Mr. Barrette (La Pinière) to Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, on the implementation of new patient-to-nurse ratios in Québec.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 38 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 38 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

#### Passage

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 29 October 2019, on the motion moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, for the passage of Bill 5, An Act to amend the Education Act and other provisions regarding preschool education services for students 4 years of age.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, was adjourned in the name of Mrs. Melançon (Verdun).
