# **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Charest, Minister for Education, together with Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), Mrs. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the achievements of the Québec athletes, members of Team Canada, who participated in the 15th edition of the Special Olympics Summer Games, which were held in Dubai and Abu Dhabi from 14 to 21 March 2019;

THAT it highlight the extraordinary performances of our athletes, which resulted in them earning 20 medals;

THAT it underscore their athletic feats and their determination, which makes them models of success and a source of inspiration for their peers, for those coming up after them and for the Québec public as a whole;

THAT, lastly, it invite the Members of this Assembly to attend a friendly soccer match between MNAs and Special Olympics athletes of Québec, being held today at the Université Laval PEPS.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Legault, Premier, Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT, for Remembrance Day, the National Assembly pay tribute to the men and women who gave their lives fighting for peace, defending our freedom and ensuring that human rights were respected;

THAT it observe a moment of silence in their memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mrs. D'Amours, Minister Responsible for Indigenous Affairs, Mr. Birnbaum (D'Arcy-McGee), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Inuit Day;

THAT, on this occasion, it highlight the resiliency of Inuit communities, who are the first to be affected by the impacts of climate change in Québec;

THAT it recognize that climate change has a major impact on communities' ability to perpetuate and transmit their traditional practices and culture;

THAT, in the pursuit of its commitment to recognize and implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the Assembly pledge to support the Inuit in the fight against and adaptation to climate change, in keeping with their autonomy and their capacity to act.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), together with Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved a motion on the continuity agreement between Rio Tinto and the Québec Government; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 34, An Act to simplify the process for establishing electricity distribution rates;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 37, An Act mainly to establish the Centre d'acquisitions gouvernementales and Infrastructures technologiques Québec;

- the Committee on Culture and Education, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 40, An Act to amend mainly the Education Act with regard to school organization and governance;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to undertake public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 43, An Act to amend the Nurses Act and other provisions in order to facilitate access to health services.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Select Committee on the Sexual Exploitation of Minors shall hold a public meeting to hold its public hearings within the framework of special consultations; and then, hold a deliberative meeting to draw up an assessment of the public hearings on the sexual exploitation of minors;
- the Committee on Institutions shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a public meeting to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on the order of initiative on the alarming increase in the use by children and youth of psychostimulants in relation to attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).

# **Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly**

Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 15 November 2019, Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau) would question Mrs. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, during an interpellation on the Government's inability to take action to preserve the quality of information in Québec.

#### **ORDERS OF THE DAY**

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, moved that Bill 41, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of certain provisions of the Budget Speeches of 17 March 2016, 28 March 2017, 27 March 2018 and 21 March 2019, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division, and Bill 41was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 41 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Passage

Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the passage of Bill 38, An Act amending certain Acts establishing public sector pension plans.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 38 was passed.

At 12.53 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 6.00 o'clock p.m.

# **Debates upon Adjournment**

At 6.07 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held two debates upon adjournment:

— the first, on a question from Mr. Derraji (Nelligan) to Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, about the CAQ Government's isolation as regards the reform of the Programme de l'expérience québécoise (PEQ – Québec experience program). Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, replaced the Minister for this debate;

— the second, on a question from Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) to Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, about the negative impact of the CAQ Government's reform of the Programme de l'expérience québécoise (PEQ – Québec experience program).

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At 6.32 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Soucy, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 12 November 2019 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
