The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Ms. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the request of the President, Mr. Legault, Premier, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 5 February 2020, on the motion moved by Mr. Fortin (Pontiac) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

The motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that there are currently not enough health professionals in most of Québec's health care institutions;

THAT it recognize that the lack of health professionals has an impact on the quality of care provided to patients;

THAT it recognize that health professionals experience dissatisfaction, distress and burnout, and that they are more often absent and at greater risk of workplace accidents;

THAT it take note that many sit-ins have been held in numerous health care institutions in various regions of Québec to deplore the understaffing and work overload; THAT it acknowledge that the pilot projects designed to test the implementation of new staff-to-patient ratios have ended and that their findings are conclusive, for both staff and patients;

THAT the National Assembly ask the CAQ Government to establish new staff-to-patient ratios immediately and to include the necessary funding in the 2020–2021 budget.

Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for Laicity and Parliamentary Reform, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion concerning the Court Challenges Program; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Legault, Premier, together with Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 18th anniversary of the signing of the Paix des braves agreement;

THAT it applaud this historic agreement, which marked a turning point in the relationship between Québec and the Cree Nation;

THAT it recognize that this treaty is a source of inspiration for deepening, on the basis of respect, trust, partnership and collaboration, nation-to-nation relations between Québec and Indigenous peoples;

Lastly, that it underline the vision and bravery of the intrepid Bernard Landry and Ted Moses, who ratified this historic agreement.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides), together with Ms. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 30th annual Suicide Prevention Week organized by the Quebec Association for Suicide Prevention under the theme "Talking about suicide saves lives";

THAT it bring to the attention of all the fact that suicide is a major global public health problem and that, as such, acting in prevention, detection, intervention and post-intervention is imperative;

THAT it recall the importance of working together in order to raise awareness and mobilize the entire population around the issues related to suicide; THAT it encourage all members of civil society to take concrete action for suicide prevention, knowing that every day in Québec three people commit suicide and approximately 75 try to end their own lives;

THAT, lastly, it ask that the Minister of Health and Social Services honour, before the end of the current mandate, the commitment she made at the Forum Adultes et santé mentale regarding the development of a national suicide prevention strategy.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

- the second, on a question from Mr. Fortin (Pontiac) to Ms. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, about the CAQ Government's inexplicable refusal to call for a debate in the House for the purpose of passing Bill 31, An Act to amend mainly the Pharmacy Act for the purpose of facilitating access to certain services and to authorize the communication of personal information concerning certain missing or deceased Aboriginal children to their families.
