The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The proceedings resumed at 10.02 o'clock a.m.

#### Moment of reflection

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request for an urgent debate from Mr. Tanguay, Official Opposition House Leader, and then received a request for an urgent debate from Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group. These requests concern the consequences for Québec of the blockade of rail lines by demonstrators opposing the Coastal GasLink pipeline project.

#### **RULING FROM THE CHAIR**

For a request for an urgent debate to be receivable, the request must concern a specific, particularly important matter that falls under the Assembly's jurisdiction. In addition, the matter must concern a sudden, acute crisis or the worsening of such a crisis. The Chair must also take into consideration whether the matter has been discussed in other circumstances and whether there will be upcoming opportunities to do so.

The requests now before the Chair do concern a specific, particularly important matter. The impact of the rail line blockade has been raised by numerous stakeholders in the business community. Among other things, it is already having major consequences for the Port of Montréal and Québec companies. Many layoffs have occurred or are envisaged in coming days. There has also been talk of food shortages and price increases. Members of the Government have noted the urgent need to take action and the possibility of police intervention has also been mentioned.

It is therefore a situation that has become significantly more serious. Moreover, the fact that the rail line blockade has lasted for many days could further aggravate the consequences for companies and lead to shortages in Québec of many essential products and raw materials. The longer this crisis continues, the worse the impact will be.

With respect to the Assembly's jurisdiction, it must be noted that although the rail line blockade is a Canada-wide crisis, tangible consequences are being felt in Québec. The blockade is preventing deliveries of goods by rail and has led to the temporary layoff of many workers, which has necessarily had a major impact on Québec's economy.

The Assembly did touch on the subject during a motion without notice moved on 18 February 2020. Although no debate was held at that time, the motion shows the parliamentarians' marked interest in this issue and its importance for Québec society. Since the Assembly will adjourn its proceedings for the two weeks set aside for riding work, there will be no opportunities to discuss the matter in the near future. Moreover, as the Assembly is at the beginning of a sessional period, there will be ample time for the Government's legislative agenda.

The main receivability criterion consists in determining the urgency of holding such a debate. The Chair considers that this is such a situation.

Therefore, the requests for an urgent debate are receivable.

#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 19 February 2020, on the motion moved by Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

The motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly reiterate the status of French as the only common and official language of Québec;

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm the fundamental right of all Quebecers to live and work in French in their territory;

THAT the National Assembly express its deep concern about the erosion of French in Québec, particularly in the metropolitan area;

THAT it recognize the need to reopen the Charter of the French language in order to reinforce the safeguards Québec has put in place, in particular to ensure the status of French as the language of the workplace;

THAT it call for businesses under federal jurisdiction to be subject to the Charter of the French language;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to table a bill ensuring that businesses with 25 to 49 employees also be subject to the requirements of the Charter.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Transport, together with Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved a motion concerning the rail line blockades in Canada; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Melançon (Verdun), together with Ms. Dorion (Taschereau), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion concerning subscriptions to cable services in Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), together with Ms. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, Mr. Benjamin (Viau), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the presence of persons of African descent in Québec since the beginning of the seventeenth century, with the arrival of Olivier Le Jeune in 1629;

THAT it recognize that Indigenous and Black persons were enslaved under the French and English regimes from 1629 until the early 1800s;

THAT it officially recognize the United Nations (UN) International Decade for People of African Descent;

THAT the National Assembly commit to fighting against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related forms of intolerance that harm people of African descent.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), together with Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to commit to requiring that all train, subway and tramway projects in Québec contain 25% Québec content.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

#### **Urgent Debates**

Before entering upon the urgent debate on the consequences for Québec of the rail line blockades by demonstrators opposed to the Coastal GasLink pipeline project, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings during this debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 27 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 12 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

Amend Recommendation 1 so that the salary rates and ranges be increased as follows:

- an increase of 3.5% as at 1 April 2019 (salary ranges in effect on 31 March 2019);
- an increase of 2.5% as at 1 April 2020 (salary ranges in effect on 31 March 2020);
- an increase of 2.0% as at 1 April 2021 (salary ranges in effect on 31 March 2021);
- an increase of 2.0% as at 1 April 2022 (salary ranges in effect on 31 March 2022);

Approve Recommendations 2 to 6.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.
