By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly affirm its strong desire to restart Québec's economy, which has been affected by the health crisis:

THAT it reiterate the motion moved by the Government and carried on 27 May 2020, which stated that economic recovery must be achieved "without weakening environmental protections";

THAT it affirm that economic recovery must also be achieved while fully preserving the fundamental rights of Quebecers;

THAT it note that Bill 61 was introduced after 15 May 2020 and that, consequently, the unanimous consent of the Members of the Assembly is required for the bill to pass before the sessional period is adjourned;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask the Government to commit to fully cooperating with the parties in Opposition and the independent Members.

THAT the National Assembly of Québec deplore that the portion of health expenditures covered by the Canadian Health Transfer has been reduced by more than half, from 50% to 23%, since its introduction;

THAT it ask the Federal Government to quickly review Canadian Health Transfer funding so as to significantly increase it for the current year and subsequent years, by raising it by at least 6%, without conditions;

THAT it reiterate emphatically that it is important to respect Québec's jurisdiction in the area of health.

THAT the National Assembly mark Stroke Month, held during the month of June;

THAT it recall that stroke is the third leading cause of death and one of the main causes of major disabilities in the country;

THAT it recognize that stroke has a significant impact on mortality and morbidity because of the physical and psychological consequences it can have on individuals of all ages and their loved ones;

THAT it recall that an emergency such as a stroke requires immediate medical attention and that people who ignore the signs are likely to suffer increasingly serious consequences, such as a greater degree of disability or even death;

THAT, for this reason, it ask the Government to continue its efforts to ensure Quebecers are better equipped to recognize the symptoms and act FAST in accordance with the international standards promoted by the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada:

FACE – is it drooping? ARMS – can you raise both? SPEECH – is it slurred or jumbled? TIME – to call 9-1-1 right away.
