Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) moved:

THAT the National Assembly emphasize that the home childcare educators' collective agreement expired a year and a half ago on 31 March 2019;

THAT it recognize that home childcare services include over 13,000 home childcare providers, and that this profession is almost exclusively female;

THAT it underscore that the intention of the members of the Fédération des intervenantes en petite enfance du Québec (FIPEQ-CSQ) to resort to strike action has been known since January 2020;

THAT it stress that the date on which the general unlimited strike is to begin in all Québec regions, that is 21 September 2020, has been known since 18 June 2020;

THAT it recognize that this general unlimited strike affects over 50,000 children and tens of thousands of Québec families;

THAT it acknowledge the fact that the heart of the dispute is the manner in which the income of home childcare providers is calculated and that the Government has questioned the numbers put forth by the FIPEQ-CSQ;

THAT it underline the importance for the Québec government to quantify in detail its calculations relating to the said income of home childcare providers;

THAT, lastly, it demand that the CAQ government immediately table in the National Assembly all the data and analyses regarding the estimated income of a home childcare provider.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 53 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 52 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 10 minutes 15 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.
