Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on appointing an independent scientific observer; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underscore the work of Québec's 9,700 pharmacists, whether they work in a community pharmacy, in a health institution or in a family medicine group;

THAT it recognize the contribution of these professionals who have been and who remain on the front line to respond to the needs and concerns of citizens, even more so during the pandemic;

THAT it underline their professionalism and co-operation with the Government so as to meet people's health needs;

THAT it underline their contribution over the coming months to Québec's flu vaccination campaign, which starts this Sunday;

THAT it reiterate that the segments of the population who are most at risk and for whom the Québec immunization program covers vaccination costs are, in particular, seniors, health workers and persons with chronic diseases;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly thank these health professionals and remind all Quebecers of the importance of following the health guidelines issued by public health authorities so that our pharmacists can continue helping the most vulnerable among us.

THAT it reiterate that freedom of conscience and freedom of religion are an integral part of the fundamental values Quebecers cherish and which are recognized and protected by Québec's *Charter of human rights and freedoms*;

THAT the National Assembly affirm that all Quebecers, whether they practise a religion and regardless of what their religion may be, have the right to live in a safe environment, without fear of intimidation or violence.
