THAT it recall that Québec is not an exception to these disturbing statistics on violence against women;

THAT it reiterate that the recent waves of denunciations have shown that still today, too many women are the victims of sexual, physical and psychological violence;

THAT it emphasize the fact that the pandemic has made this problem worse for many women who have been confined at home with their abuser for weeks at a time:

THAT, lastly, it stress the importance of providing additional resources to these women not only during the holiday season, but also at all times of the year.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Transport, moved that Bill 71, An Act respecting off-highway vehicles, do now pass in principle.

At 1:00 p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until  $3:00\ \text{p.m.}$ 

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Transport, was adjourned in the name of Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier).

The proceedings resumed at 3:00 p.m.

#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mr. Derraji (Nelligan) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that thousands of small and medium-sized enterprises are currently required to stay closed due to the restrictions imposed on businesses located in maximum alert zones:

THAT it recognize that the companies not in maximum alert zones but rather in yellow and orange zones must also contend with major reductions in their volume of business;

THAT it acknowledge that the Government's decisions have a huge impact on the finances of our Québec SMEs;

THAT it realize that enterprises must, among other things, continue paying their fixed operating costs;

THAT it take notice of the fact that the assistance measures proposed by the CAQ government greatly increase Québec SMEs' level of indebtedness;

THAT it denounce the fact that the assistance for businesses in maximum alert zones has not been made available to businesses elsewhere in Québec;

THAT it denounce the delays Québec enterprises have incurred while waiting for the disbursements in connection with the government assistance measures;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly demand that the Québec government promptly establish a moral contract with Québec SMEs that includes additional direct assistance measures and improved assistance foreseeability and access.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 53 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 52 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 10 minutes 15 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by an independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.
