Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Culture and Education, which held public hearings on 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 August 2019 within the framework of special consultations on the order of initiative on the future of the news media. The report contains observations and 20 recommendations.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 27 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 12 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by an independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Ms. Melançon (Verdun).
