The Assembly was called to order at 10 a.m.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Transportation and the Environment on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 46, An Act to amend the Natural Heritage Conservation Act and other provisions, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, and Ms. Ghazal (Mercier).

The amendment introduced by the Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change was declared in order.

The amendments tabled by the Member for Mercier were declared in order, except for the amendment proposed to amend section 32 of the *Heritage Conservation Act* as replaced by section 32 of the bill, which was declared out of order. Indeed, this proposed amendment is intended to amend a paragraph of the bill that was previously struck out during the Committee's clause-by-clause consideration of the bill. The amendment is therefore intended to amend a non-existent paragraph, which makes it out of order. After debate thereon, Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, put the question on the amendments; at 11:30 a.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 2 February 2021, Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

The proceedings resumed at 11:39 a.m.

The question was put on the amendment proposed by Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 2 February 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

The amendment was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved a motion on the increase in the number of places in the college network; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mr. Tardif (Rivière-du-Loup–Témiscouata), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec pay tribute to the recently deceased Mr. Michel Auger, journalist and crime reporter;

THAT it highlight his exceptional career, which spanned more than 40 years;

THAT it recall that he survived an attempt on his life on 13 September 2000;

THAT the National Assembly welcome the recent CNESST decision requiring all health care workers working in a hot zone to wear a type N95 protective device or higher;

THAT it acknowledge that from June 2020 to February 2021, a public health order formally prohibited the use of N95 masks in any context not involving aerosol-generating medical procedures (AGMP);

THAT it ask the Government to act on the CNESST decision and ensure that those working in hot zones have access to N95 masks.

#### Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 10 February 2021, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly unequivocally affirm that it is the sole guardian of the democratic will of the people of Québec;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the office of Lieutenant Governor is essentially symbolic and inherited from the colonial past of Québec and Canada; THAT the Assembly recall the CAQ government's commitment to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor when the context permits it;

THAT it emphasize the fact that 74% of Quebecers wish to abolish the monarchy in Québec;

THAT it take note of the recent resignation of the last Governor General of Canada, following a report confirming a toxic work environment, as well as Barbados' decision to free itself of the British monarchy by November 30 of this year;

THAT it demand that the Government of Canada reimburse the Government of Québec the portion of expenses related to the office of Governor General paid by Québec taxpayers;

THAT the National Assembly agree to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor and all other symbols of the British monarchy in Québec.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned earlier in the sitting, on the motion moved by Mr. Boulet, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, that Bill°59, An Act to modernize the occupational health and safety regime, do now pass in principle.

At the end of her address, Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) moved the following hoist motion:

THAT the motion under debate be amended by striking out the word "now" and by adding at the end thereof the words "this day three weeks hence".

At 5:33 p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

The proceedings resumed at 5:39 p.m.

The hoist motion was ruled in order.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 57 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 42 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 9 minutes 55 seconds to the Third Opposition Group, and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by an independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The Assembly entered upon the debate on the hoist motion moved by Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard).

#### **Debates Upon Adjournment**

At 6:31 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 2 February 2021, the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mr. Ciccone (Marquette) to Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Transport, about the CAQ government's inconsistencies with regard to the Québec City tramway project.

At 6:41 p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 10 February 2021 at 9:40 a.m.
