By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), together with Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the high ethical standards governing parliamentarians and members of the Cabinet under the *Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly* are essential to ensure integrity and the confidence of Quebecers, which are indispensable to the functioning of the State's affairs;

THAT it recall that all elected officials and ministers must comply with the obligations of the *Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly* and the recommendations and directives of the Ethics Commissioner, without exception.

THAT it underscore that production, transformation and recycling of critical and strategic minerals provide important economic development opportunities for many of Québec's regions and that these development activities generate a wide range of well-paid jobs, both in the host communities and across the province;

THAT it recognize that Québec's environmental and labour protection laws and regulations make Québec a responsible, ethical leader with regard to the development of its critical and strategic mineral potential;

THAT it mention that in a context where Québec is already Canada's largest consumer of electric cars, the development of critical and strategic minerals would make it possible for Canada to be a key player in the energy storage, battery and telecommunications fields, which will be at the heart of Québec's path toward becoming carbon neutral;

THAT, lastly, it recognize that, given such promising mineral potential, our internationally recognized expertise, our highly competitive renewable energy and our extremely high social and environmental standards, it is absolutely necessary to seize all the opportunities that Québec has to offer.

THAT it strongly condemn racism in all its forms, and especially towards Indigenous persons;

THAT it recognize the role of the Québec State to take action as a leader to build bridges between nations and fight against racism and discrimination;

THAT all Members of the National Assembly apologize to Jocelyne Ottawa, the Atikamekw de Manawan Nation and all Indigenous people for the irreparable consequences of the racism experienced in Québec health and social services institutions;

THAT the National Assembly recognize the importance of taking the necessary measures so that Indigenous people have access, without discrimination, to all health and social services and that they may, in complete equality, achieve the best possible physical and mental health;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Government adopt a clear policy direction and commitment to the concept of cultural safety by enshrining it in the *Act respecting health services and social services*, as recommended by the Viens Commission and approved unanimously by motion of the National Assembly on 7 October 2020;

THAT, to that end, the Government grant the necessary funding and ensure that all institutions in the health and social services network step up their efforts to implement services and programs that meet the principles of cultural safety and are developed for and in collaboration with Indigenous peoples.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 17 March 2021, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Fortin, Official Opposition House Leader.

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the COVID-19 pandemic has had and will have a major impact on economic growth, the job market and the labour shortage, as well as on Québec's public finances;

THAT it acknowledge that the CAQ government will table its 2021–2022 budget on 25 March;

THAT it ask the Government to put in place the necessary measures to ensure the economy recovers and our public services improve, while maintaining the current framework and protecting the sums accumulated in the Generations Fund; THAT it ask the Government to be flexible regarding the goal of returning to a balanced budget;

THAT it ask the Government to put in place a modern and egalitarian economic recovery plan which will provide equal opportunities for women and men;

THAT it ask that Québec's economic recovery involve increased support for research and innovation in order to help businesses in all sectors adapt to the new reality and develop new markets:

THAT it ask the Government to ensure that citizens have access to the health care to which they are entitled, in particular by establishing a fund for catching up on delayed surgeries and a universal public program for free access to psychotherapy;

THAT it also ask the Government to support young Quebecers by creating the promised childcare spaces, improving the tutoring program and providing financial assistance to cover the costs for parents who hire resources to support learning;

THAT it ask the Government to support Québec seniors by ensuring that the tax credit for home-support services is more appropriate and more generous;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to further support Québec's small and medium-sized businesses that have suffered, in particular by adjusting its business assistance programs to provide more direct assistance, abolishing the criteria excluding access to the small business deduction for the service sectors and providing greater flexibility in the conditions for repaying loans.
