#### Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations

The President ruled on the point of privilege or contempt raised on 1 April 2021 by the House Leader of the Second Opposition Group concerning certain statements made by the Minister of Education with regard to the participation of public health in drafting a protocol for measuring air quality in schools.

#### RULING FROM THE CHAIR

Parliamentary jurisprudence has recognized that the deliberate misleading of the Assembly or of its committees can constitute contempt of Parliament. It has also affirmed on numerous occasions that two conditions must be met to overturn the presumption that parliamentarians must be taken at their word. First, the Member must have misled the Assembly or a committee when speaking, and second, the Member must subsequently acknowledge having done so deliberately.

The Chair has also ruled on several occasions that a Member giving two contradictory versions of the same facts in the context of parliamentary proceedings could also have the effect of misleading the House, justifying raising a point of contempt of Parliament.

In all cases, the intentional nature of the act must be proven in order to conclude that a Member knowingly misled the House. In other words, for an allegation of misleading the Assembly to be able to raise a point of privilege, there must be a clear demonstration of the intent to mislead or hinder parliamentary proceedings.

Opposition group leaders have reported several statements on Public Health's role in drafting documents regarding CO<sub>2</sub> testing in schools. Some statements were made by the Minister of Education, the Minister of Families and the Premier in the context of parliamentary proceedings, others were made by public servants who work for the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux, members of the Direction générale de la santé publique du Québec and the INSPQ, and these have been reported on by the media.

After considering these statements, one can see that not all actors involved share the same point of view with regard to the role of Public Health in developing the protocol for testing air quality in schools and related directives. In this regard, one can certainly conclude that there is evidence of disagreement.

In arguments on this point of privilege, some have called on the Chair to separate fact from fiction or, in other words, to determine who is telling the truth in this matter.

In determining whether a Member has *prima facie* misled the House, the Chair's role is not to settle a factual debate or to decide which version of the facts should prevail. In determining whether a question of privilege is in order, the Chair need only consider whether the conditions established in jurisprudence have been met.

At no time has it been demonstrated that the Minister admitted to having misled the House or that he knowingly sought to mislead the House or to hinder parliamentary proceedings. In fact, it has not been alleged that the Minister of Education made contradictory statements on this matter. On the contrary, it has been affirmed that the Minister has repeated the same statements over and over again. Whereas, evidence of contradictory statements made by a Member is required to demonstrate that the House has been misled, thus justifying raising a point of contempt.

Yet, there is no evidence that the Minister of Education knowingly attempted to mislead the House. This is rather a matter of several individuals having interpreted the same situation differently. Jurisprudence is, however, clear in this regard: differing interpretations of the same situation by different people cannot give rise to contempt of Parliament.

It is of course important that Members, and even more so Ministers, provide the clearest information possible during debates, particularly in order to maintain public trust and support. In this regard, Public Health's role in developing the protocol for testing air quality in schools was an important issue for many people. The Minister of Education could certainly have been more specific in his remarks. This is not to say, however, that he attempted to mislead the House. The Chair is not required to determine which version of the facts stated by a Member or a body it prefers.

For these reasons, the point of privilege raised is declared out of order.

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the work accomplished by elected municipal officials is essential and key to ensuring the governance and delivery of services to the Québec population throughout the province;

THAT it encourage the public to take an interest in the role of elected municipal officials and participate in municipal democracy in all its forms;

THAT it thank elected municipal officials and recall that they have worked tirelessly during the pandemic to meet the needs of their communities and maintain quality services;

THAT it strongly denounce the intimidation faced by many elected municipal officials;

THAT the National Assembly declare that it is essential and healthy for our municipal democracy to debate, provided that the exchanges are respectful and civil;

THAT, lastly, it reiterate that provincial elected officials must serve as exemplary role models, as mentioned by the two main unions, the UMQ and the FQM.

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 13 April 2021, on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Ms. Sauvé (Fabre), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Ms. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) and Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine), subject to the receivability of these motions.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 276, Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque) commented on behalf of the Third Opposition Group.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 276, Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) commented on behalf of the Second Opposition Group.

The debate being concluded, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, declared that the motions stating a grievance were receivable, except the motion moved by Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), with respect to which he ruled the following:

#### **RULING FROM THE CHAIR**

The motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) within the framework of the Budget Speech is not receivable on the grounds that, contrary to Standing Order 191, it contains arguments.

In the past, parliamentary jurisprudence has explained that argumentation is understood to mean anything which tends to support the conclusion sought in the motion. The Chair has already declared out of order motions whose wording was similar to that of the motion moved by the Member for Sherbrooke.

On behalf of the Member concerned, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, requested that the Assembly grant leave to replace the aforementioned unreceivable motion by a new motion that complies with the Standing Orders.

By leave of the Assembly, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, tabled the motion by Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), which now reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its 2021–2022 budget, which does not alleviate underinvestment in education and early childcare sectors.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, then proceeded to put the question on the motions stating a grievance moved during the debate. At 5:37 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 13 April 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

# **ROYAL ASSENT**
