By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, together with Ms. Ménard (Laporte), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 15th anniversary of the Canada-Quebec Agreement on UNESCO, signed on 5 May 2006, which established the Government of Québec's formal presence within Canada's Permanent Delegation to this institution of the United Nations;

THAT it highlight the fact that the agreement constitutes a unique precedent for UNESCO and the United Nations system, allowing Québec to make its voice heard, particularly in education, culture, artificial intelligence, open science and gender equality;

THAT it underscore that the agreement recognizes Québec's specificity, based, among other things, on use of the French language and a unique culture;

THAT it recall that the agreement helps raise the international profile of Québec, the Québec government and its civil society partners;

THAT, lastly, it affirm its support for the UNESCO mission and objectives to promote peacebuilding, poverty eradication, sustainable development, gender equality and intercultural dialogue through education, science, culture, communication and information.

THAT the National Assembly of Québec mark the 60th anniversary of the coming into force of the statute establishing the Ministère des Affaires culturelles du Québec;

THAT it recognize the vision of the department's initiator and first head, Mr. Georges-Émile Lapalme, for whom the department's establishment ushered in a new era for Québec, in particular by closely linking culture to the protection of the French language;

THAT it also underline the work of all those who, for all these years, have passionately and tirelessly worked to help this department grow;

THAT it recall that Québec culture is vibrant, dynamic and known around the world, and that it is therefore a source of pride for all Quebecers;

THAT it ask the Government to repatriate all federal powers and budgets regarding culture based on Québec's historical proportion in order to fully take charge of the cultural development of the Québec nation;

THAT, lastly, it congratulate the former Member for Bourget, Claude Trudel, who sat in this assembly from 1985 to 1989, for the publication of the book "Une histoire du ministère de la Culture", which recounts this great department's 60-year history in a remarkable manner.
