THAT it note that this hospital is finding it increasingly difficult to meet the needs of the population of Montréal's east end and surrounding areas due to its condition, in particular because several sectors are no longer adequate or functional;

THAT it acknowledge that it will take several years to build a new hospital, and that as a result there will be increased pressure on health services, increased wait times for the care offered to the population and an impact on the ability to attract new personnel to the hospital;

THAT it underscore the fact that a broad coalition of health professionals, caregivers, users and elected officials from the city's east end was recently formed to demand a specific timeline for the construction of a new hospital;

THAT it recall that this project is under study in the Québec Infrastructure Plan, that it mainly aims to modernize the hospital's facilities, and that it is necessary to do more than is currently planned in terms of modernizing the hospital's facilities;

THAT the National Assembly note that this project is currently in the Business Case stage, which will make it possible to determine the best long-term sustainable option to meet the needs of Montréal's east-end population;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to make known the details concerning the Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont project as soon as possible.

#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) moved:

THAT the National Assembly note that according to Public Health data, the epidemiological situation related to the COVID-19 pandemic is stable or improving day by day, and the vaccination campaign is proceeding smoothly;

THAT it take into account the fact that the Government announced a gradual deconfinement plan last week;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the concept of a state of emergency is an exception to the principle of democracy which is justified only when a situation represents a serious threat to the health of the population, whether it be real or apprehended;

THAT the National Assembly recall the importance of establishing a clear framework to guide the return to a state of normal democracy;

THAT the National Assembly therefore ask the Government to commit to ending the health emergency once, among other things, its vaccination objectives have been met and the number of hospitalizations resulting from COVID-19 is under control, and to include opposition parties in the process.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 47 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 27 minutes 58 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 9 minutes 59 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 19 minutes 3 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of her address, Ms. Guilbault, Deputy Premier, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Îles-de-la-Madeleine be amended

- (1) by striking out "is an exception to the principle of democracy which" and "only" in the third paragraph;
- (2) by replacing "state of normal democracy" in the fourth paragraph by "normal situation";

(3) by replacing the last paragraph by the following: "THAT the National Assembly therefore ask the Government to commit to ending the health emergency once its vaccination objectives have been met and the number of COVID-19 hospitalizations and new daily cases are under control, subject to the public health authorities' identification of any apprehended threat, in collaboration with all Members of the National Assembly."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that according to Public Health data, the epidemiological situation related to the COVID-19 pandemic is stable or improving day by day, and the vaccination campaign is proceeding smoothly;

THAT it take into account the fact that the Government announced a gradual deconfinement plan last week;

THAT the National Assembly recall the importance of establishing a clear framework to guide the return to a normal situation:

THAT the National Assembly therefore ask the Government to commit to ending the health emergency once its vaccination objectives have been met and the number of COVID-19 hospitalizations and new daily cases are under control, subject to the public health authorities' identification of any apprehended threat, in collaboration with all Members of the National Assembly.
