Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-dela-Madeleine), together with Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

> THAT the National Assembly recall the importance of equity, which must guide government action when it comes to carrying out projects, in particular for transportation infrastructure;

> THAT it stress that there can be no significant distinction between ridings, based on whether they are represented by a Member of the party forming the Government or of the Opposition;

> THAT it reiterate that, in this sense, ridings represented by a Member of an opposition party should never be disadvantaged, just as ridings represented by a Member of the governing party should not have any undue advantage;

THAT the National Assembly condemn the outdated idea that a Member of the governing party is in a position to obtain more for his or her riding;

THAT, lastly, it reaffirm that the common good is the only criterion that should guide the selection of the projects the Québec government invests in.

THAT it reiterate the importance of the *Consumer Protection Act*, passed on 14 July 1971, which established the Office and made Québec a pioneer in the field of protecting consumers' rights;

THAT it recognize the contribution of this organization over the past five decades as well as that of the various partner organizations dedicated to equipping, protecting and informing citizens; THAT it recognize that the Office will be called on to play a role of great importance in the coming years with respect to many challenges of modern society, in particular with regard to sustainable consumption and the obsolescence of consumer products;

THAT, lastly, it take this opportunity today to thank all of the Office's personnel, past and present, for their work and commitment to promoting and defending the rights of Quebecers.

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge, with shock and horror, the discovery of the remains of 215 children found buried on the site of a former residential school in Kamloops, British Columbia;

THAT it recall that according to estimates by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, 4,100 children died in residential schools in Canada, including at least 18 who have been identified in Québec; THAT it strongly condemn the Indian residential school system put in place by the federal government, which was implemented in Québec from 1931 to 1991, and which constituted a means of cultural genocide;

THAT it also strongly condemn the "Sixties Scoop", the federal government's mass removal of Indigenous children from their homes, communities and families;

THAT it express its solidarity with all Indigenous nations in Québec and Canada who continue to seek the truth about their missing loved ones and who are, to this day, living with the impacts and trauma of the residential school system;

THAT it ask the Government of Québec to take the necessary measures in collaboration with the Indigenous authorities and the Government of Canada so that searches are carried out at former residential school sites in Québec in order to look for any evidence of human remains;

THAT it ask the Office of the National Assembly to examine the possibility of erecting a memorial on the National Assembly's grounds, in collaboration with representatives of the First Nations and the Inuit;

THAT it ask the federal government to make available all the information at its disposal to families who will undertake formalities following the passage of Bill 79;

THAT, lastly, it observe a minute of silence in memory of the 215 children whose remains were found as well as of all missing Indigenous children across the country.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.
