THAT, lastly, it call on the federal Minister of Immigration to take the necessary steps to grant Canadian citizenship to Mr. Badawi as quickly as possible.

THAT it extend its condolences to all Muslim communities in Canada, to the Muslim community of London, and to the family of the victims, in particular young Faez Afzaal, who is now an orphan;

THAT, lastly, the Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the four victims.
