THAT the National Assembly note that the Montréal financial community is rallying together to attract to the city the future headquarters of the new international regulatory body for sustainable finance, the International Sustainability Standards Board:

THAT it acknowledge the release on 4 October 2021 of the Statement by the Quebec Financial Centre for a Sustainable Finance by more than 20 Québec financial stakeholders, an initiative to "strengthen the sustainable finance ecosystem and make Québec a center of excellence in this field";

THAT it underline Québec's potential for sustainable finance internationally;

THAT it support Montréal's bid to establish the future headquarters of the International Sustainability Standards Board;
