Opening Speech Debate of the Session

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 28 October 2021, on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Mr. Legault, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Arcand (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Ms. Samson (Iberville), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Derraji (Nelligan), Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue), Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Birnbaum (D'Arcy-McGee), Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) and Ms. Hivon (Joliette), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his address, Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for the chronic underfunding imposed on community organizations, despite their essential contribution during the pandemic and the explosion of needs of populations in vulnerable situations.

The debate continued on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Mr. Legault, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Arcand (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Ms. Samson (Iberville), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Derraji (Nelligan), Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue), Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Birnbaum (D'Arcy-McGee), Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Ms. Hivon (Joliette) and Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his address, Mr. Fortin, Official Opposition House Leader, moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its lack of vision regarding mobility aimed at reducing user travel times.

The debate continued on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Mr. Legault, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Arcand (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Ms. Samson (Iberville), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Derraji (Nelligan), Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue), Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Birnbaum (D'Arcy-McGee), Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Mr. Fortin, Official Opposition House Leader, subject to the receivability of these motions.

The debate being concluded, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, then proceeded to put the question on the motions stating a grievance moved during the debate; at 11:43 a.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

The proceedings resumed at 11:53 a.m.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, declared that the motions stating a grievance were receivable, except the motion moved by Ms. Samson (Iberville), with respect to which he ruled the following:

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

The motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Samson (Iberville) within the framework of the Opening Speech of the Session is not receivable on the grounds that it contains certain words deemed unparliamentary. The motion imputes improper motives to the Government, which is prohibited under the Standing Orders.

First, the question was put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition. This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Premier for having presented an assessment of the Government's actions without including a true innovative and ambitious vision for Québec's future and solutions for the two major crises that Québec faces: the fight against climate change and the labour shortage.

In accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its lack of vision and lack of a plan for the future development of higher education in Québec.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 3 November 2021 during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent).

THAT the National Assembly recall that the Premier has repeatedly stated that education was his number one priority;

THAT it take note that the school dropout rate has doubled in many regions of Québec;

THAT it note that there are more than 30,000 teachers not legally qualified in the education network;

THAT it take note that many school administration staff members have left the network due to burnout;

THAT it take note that hundreds of aspiring teachers do not have access to a qualifying master's degree despite the fact that their file meets admission requirements;

THAT it note that parents of students with special needs must send their bill to the Minister in order to be reimbursed for services that their children should have received at school;

THAT it take note that a serious shortage of personnel exists in school daycares;

THAT it note that the Minister of Education has not been able to implement a satisfactory response to these issues;

THAT, lastly, it demand that the Premier appoint, as soon as possible, a new Minister of Education capable of displaying the leadership required to bring together all the actors from the education network in order to remedy the situation.
