THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that prostate cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in men and that approximately 4,300 Quebecers will be diagnosed with this cancer in 2021, and an estimated 890 will die from it;

THAT it recall the importance of raising public awareness about prostate cancer screening and about men's health in general;

THAT it recall that greater awareness and early detection save lives, as we have witnessed firsthand by the continued presence in this Chamber of the Member for Vimont;

THAT it recall that PROCURE is a charitable organization dedicated to fighting prostate cancer and that it educates, supports and informs those affected by this disease in addition to promoting and contributing to the financing of world-class research;

THAT it applaud the 50% decrease in the prostate cancer death rate since its peak in 1995, a decrease that is attributable to investments in research and also to the awareness-raising efforts of PROCURE and of its ambassador emeritus Jean Pagé to ensure that men get screened earlier, thereby reducing the death rate;

THAT it recall that the 8th edition of PROCURE's Bowvember fundraising campaign offers Quebecers the opportunity to sport a bow tie throughout the month of November, and more particularly on November 19;

THAT it thank Quebecers having already participated in the 2021 Bowvember fundraising campaign in order to support the fight against prostate cancer and that it encourage the population to participate in this fundraising campaign;

THAT, lastly, it recognize the courage shown by all those afflicted with this disease, as well as their loved ones.
