#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lemieux (Saint-Jean), together with Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), Ms. Labrie, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Fonds Claude-Raymond created on 12 August 1971;

THAT it commend the importance of its mission, namely that of fostering and promoting the practice of sports, the pursuit of excellence, and the development of the youth in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu and its region through financial assistance;

THAT it take note that over the years the Fonds Claude-Raymond has donated more than \$2 million to 462 organizations and 2,298 young people in the areas of sports, the arts, science and culture;

THAT it recall that Claude Raymond was the first Québec baseball player to be invited to the Major League Baseball All-Star Game, where he made a career from 1959 to 1971 as a relief pitcher for 6 legendary teams in the MLB, including the Montreal Expos;

THAT it also recall that for decades Claude Raymond was a baseball analyst on radio and television to the great delight of Québec baseball fans who watched with pride as he became a pitching coach for the Montreal Expos a few seasons before the team moved to Washington in 2004;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly applaud this great Quebecer and thank him for his dedication and service to his community by highlighting the celebrations being held this week in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu to mark the 50th anniversary of the fund that bears his name and to honour the outstanding career and legacy of Mr. Claude Raymond.

THAT the National Assembly congratulate the persons elected on November 7 in the cities, towns and municipalities of Québec;

THAT it take note that voter turnout among young people is generally lower than that of the general population;

THAT it recognize that the possibility of registering and voting on the campuses of higher education institutions during elections is appreciated and increases voter turnout among young people;

THAT it wish this to be also possible during municipal elections:

THAT it recall that several student associations support this measure:

THAT the National Assembly ask Élections Québec to consider the possibility of allowing on-campus voting in the next municipal elections to be held in 2025.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 23 November 2021, on the hoist motion moved by Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier) during the debate on the passage in principle of Bill 7, An Act to facilitate the conduct of the next provincial general election in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic and to amend the Election Act.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier) was adjourned in the name of Mr. Barrette (La Pinière).

#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) moved:

THAT the National Assembly note that the coroner's inquest into the management of the pandemic in CHSLDs has revealed serious deficiencies, gaps and inconsistencies in the health network;

THAT it deplore the lack of comprehensive oversight, despite the various and frequent revelations in the media;

THAT it affirm that the impacts of the mismanagement of the pandemic have been felt in all sectors of society;

THAT it recognize that Quebecers and more specifically seniors and their families have suffered from the Government's improvisation and lack of professionalism;

THAT it highlight that the public has not had access to the written notices and documents that were used by the Government to make decisions, notably those issued by public health authorities:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to immediately establish a public inquiry, under the *Act respecting public inquiry commissions*, on the management of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 46 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 27 minutes 29 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 21 minutes 39 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 7 minutes 7 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 7 minutes 30 seconds to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; at 4:59 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.
