THAT the National Assembly mark that today is the International Day of Persons with Disabilities under the theme "Leadership and participation of persons with disabilities toward an inclusive, accessible and sustainable post-COVID-19 world";

THAT it recall that in Québec, 16% of the population over age 15, which is a little more than one million people, lives with a disability;

THAT it underline that, despite their disabilities, the contribution of people with disabilities is invaluable;

THAT it recall that, in the context of a labour shortage, the contribution of people with disabilities is more essential than ever;

THAT it recall that Québec is in the midst of the 12 Days of Action to End Violence Against Women campaign and that it is urgent to reflect on the fight against and elimination of violence against women and girls with disabilities in all their diversity;

THAT it underline the urgency of ensuring assistance, support and accompaniment services that are appropriate and available to all;

THAT it recall that building safe, egalitarian and inclusive communities requires concrete actions that meet the needs of people with disabilities;

THAT, lastly, it call on the Government to implement additional measures to better support people with disabilities and that it encourage businesses to recruit more of these dedicated workers.
