Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Mr. Carmant, Minister for Health and Social Services, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Autism Month and underscore the importance of raising awareness in order to overcome prejudice;

THAT it recall that people with autism need services, care and support from our institutions;

THAT it underscore that people with autism can and want to contribute to society, and that they want to be listened to and heard, and to love and be loved;

THAT it recall that people with autism must have the same rights as all of us and that their difference should be an asset to our society, not a constraint;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to be an example of inclusion, so that people with autism can achieve their dream of actively participating and being fully accepted in society.

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the deplorable situation at Rouyn-Noranda's Centre jeunesse La Maison, where teenagers are living in a converted gymnasium, in tiny rooms without doors or windows, with only a mattress on the floor and without direct access to bathroom facilities;

THAT it deplore the fact that this unacceptable situation, which was supposed to be temporary, has now lasted nine months;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to immediately take appropriate measures to ensure a dignified living environment for these adolescents.

THAT the National Assembly highlight the importance of recognizing, protecting and promoting academic freedom;

THAT it recognize the mission of universities, which is to produce and transmit knowledge through research, creation, teaching and community services;

THAT it recall that university autonomy and academic freedom are essential conditions to fulfill the mission of universities;

THAT it underscore that students must receive quality education;

THAT it state that institutions must defend and protect academic freedom against any pressure to limit its exercise or scope, whether from inside or outside the institution;

THAT it affirm that, in their educational context, classrooms cannot be considered "safe spaces" and that it recognize that all ideas and topics, without exception, can be debated at universities in a rational and reasoned way;

THAT, lastly, it specify that trigger warnings fall under the educational choices of faculty members and are part of the exercise of academic freedom.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 6 April 2022, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Derraji (Nelligan).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly deplore the fact that after nearly 4 years of a CAQ government, the number of Quebecers waiting for a family doctor has increased from 400,000 to more than one million;

THAT it recall that the Coalition Avenir Québec promised, during the 2018 election campaign, that a CAQ government would provide a family doctor for all Quebecers;

THAT it acknowledge that the CAQ government has broken its promise to Quebecers and no longer intends to provide a family doctor for all Quebecers;

THAT it recognize that the health reform tabled by the CAQ government will not solve the problems of access to primary care:

THAT it note that Quebecers are now paying the price for the CAQ government's inaction and lack of leadership in health care;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly condemn the CAQ government's abandonment of access to a family doctor for all Quebecers.
