The Assembly was called to order at 9:40 a.m.

ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 31 May 2022, on the motion moved by Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health and Social Services, for the passage of Bill 28, An Act to terminate the public health emergency while maintaining transitional measures necessary to protect the health of the population (*modified title*).

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 68 Nays: 42 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 28 was passed.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Families, together with Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Ms. Labrie, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the essential role of early childhood educators in developing our children's full potential;

THAT it underline the importance of acknowledging the valuable work these educators do and the contribution they make to Québec society every day, particularly in the exceptional context of the last two years;

THAT it officially recognize the Semaine nationale des éducatrices et des éducateurs de la petite enfance, which will take place every year during the last week of October; THAT it note that this initiative is part of the project Grand chantier pour les familles, launched last October to recognize the specific and unique skills of educators;

THAT, lastly, it recall that the first edition of this special week will take place from 24 to 30 October 2022.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides), together with Ms. Ghazal (Mercier) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved a motion on immigration and the vitality of the French language in Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Labrie, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), moved a motion on the Superior Court of Québec's judgment giving asylum seekers access to subsidized childcare spaces; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), together with Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Ms. Samson (Iberville), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the fifth anniversary of the passage of a legislative amendment proclaiming the month of June as Water Month; THAT it reaffirm the collective nature of water resources and that these resources are part of the common heritage of the Québec nation;

THAT it recall that, in Québec, sustainable water management is based on transparency, the achievement of which depends on public access to important data concerning the quantities of water withdrawn;

THAT it acknowledge the Court of Québec's decision in the case of access to information on the volumes of water withdrawn by each bottling company, which confirms that trade secrecy protects this information;

THAT it recognize that, in this context, a legislative amendment must be considered;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask the Government to assess the possibility of amending the legal framework so that information about the quantities of water withdrawn is of a public nature.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to hear the interested parties and undertake clause-by-clause consideration of these private bills in the order indicated hereafter: Bill 209, An Act respecting Ville de Longueuil; Bill 203, An Act respecting Ville de Laval; Bill 205, An Act respecting Ville de Victoriaville.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 236, Ms. Laforest, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, moved that Bill 37, An Act to amend various legislative provisions mainly with respect to housing, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division, and Bill 37 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 37 be referred to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

At 1:00 p.m., Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3:00 p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3:00 p.m.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 4, An Act to reinforce the governance of state-owned enterprises and to amend other legislative provisions, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin) and Ms. Ghazal (Mercier).

The amendments were declared in order, except those proposed by Ms. Ghazal (Mercier) amending section 21 and removing section 249.3 of the bill. The first was declared out of order because it concerns elements not addressed in the bill, the second because parliamentary jurisprudence has established that only the author of a bill may introduce such an amendment.

After debate thereon, by leave of the Assembly, Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, put the question on the amendments individually, except certain amendments proposed by Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), and on the reading thereof.

First, the question was put on the amendment proposed by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin) introducing section 252.1; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions on the amendments proposed by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin) and Ms. Ghazal (Mercier) and on the report from the Committee on Public Finance were deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Citizen Relations on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 32, An Act respecting academic freedom in the university sector, together with the amendments transmitted by Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) and Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve).

The amendments were declared in order.

After debate thereon, by leave of the Assembly, Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, put the question on the amendments individually and on the reading thereof.

First, the question was put on the amendment proposed by Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) to section 3.

The amendment was negatived.

The question was then put on the amendment proposed by Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) to section 8.

The amendment was negatived.

The question was then put on the amendment proposed by Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) to section 6.

The amendment was negatived.

The question was then put on the amendment proposed by Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) introducing section 6.1.

The amendment was negatived.

Lastly, the report was concurred in on division.

Private Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Lévesque (Chapleau) moved that Private Bill 206, An Act respecting the International Air Transport Association, do now pass in principle.

The motion was carried and, accordingly, Private Bill 206 was passed in principle.

Passage

By leave of the Assembly to set aside section 35 of the Rules for the Conduct of Proceedings, Mr. Lévesque (Chapleau) moved that Private Bill 206, An Act respecting the International Air Transport Association, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Private Bill 206 was accordingly passed.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 35, An Act to harmonize and modernize the rules relating to the professional status of artists, together with the amendments transmitted by Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie).

The amendments were declared in order.

A debate arose thereon.

At 5:09 p.m., Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

The proceedings resumed at 5:20 p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on consideration of the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 35, An Act to harmonize and modernize the rules relating to the professional status of artists, together with the amendments transmitted by Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie).

The debate being concluded, by leave of the Assembly, Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, put the question on the whole of the amendments proposed by Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie) and on the reading thereof.

The question was put on the amendments; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions on the amendments proposed by Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie) and on the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy were deferred until Routine Proceedings of the next sitting day.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 2 June 2022 at 9:40 a.m.

The motion was carried.
