Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

Motions Without Notice

Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Ms. Hivon (Joliette), moved a motion on payments to childcare centres (CPE) and home childcare services; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), together with Mr. Rousselle (Vimont), Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved a motion concerning the examination of decriminalizing the simple possession of certain drugs in Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), together with Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), moved a motion on the granting of paid leave for victims of domestic violence; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), Ms. Dorion (Taschereau), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 40-year career of singer-songwriter Mario Pelchat;

THAT it recognize that his deep, melodious voice has raised Québec's profile within La Francophonie and elsewhere internationally;

THAT it recall that this singer is one of the most appreciated Québec artists internationally thanks to his talent and versatility, in particular through his role in the musical *Don Juan*;

THAT it recognize his extraordinary flair, as a producer, for finding and showcasing local talent, thus contributing to the development of the next generation of Québec musicians;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly congratulate Mario Pelchat for his splendid career, by which he has truly enriched Québec culture and made all Quebecers very proud.

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly reiterate the importance of Gaspesian Day by highlighting this region's essential contribution to the development of the Québec nation.
