Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Fournier, Minister responsible for the Reform of Democratic Institutions and Access to Information, moved, —That Bill 132, An Act to suspend the electoral division delimitation process, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

At 12.52 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. McKay (L'Assomption) moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec demand that a moratorium on shale gas exploration and extraction be immediately decreed until the entry into force of new legislative and regulatory provisions aiming to ensure a development of these activities that is safe for both the environment and public health.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply, 5 minutes shall be allotted to the Member for Mercier; 1 minute and 37 seconds shall be allotted to each of the other independent Members; 7 minutes and 42 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; the remaining time shall be shared equally among the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members of the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, that is, 47 minutes for each of the two parliamentary groups; within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members of by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mr. McKay (L'Assomption) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the end of his address, Mr. Gautrin (Verdun) moved:

THAT the motion by the Member for L'Assomption be amended as follows: by replacing, in the first, second and third lines, the words "demand that a moratorium on shale gas exploration and extraction be immediately decreed until" by the words "ask that there not be commercial extraction of shale gas before 2014, after".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec ask that there not be commercial extraction of shale gas before 2014, after the entry into force of new legislative and regulatory provisions aiming to ensure a development of these activities that is safe for both the environment and public health.

Mr. McKay (L'Assomption) refused the amendment proposed by Mr. Gautrin (Verdun).

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The debate continued on the motion by Mr. McKay (L'Assomption).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 11 November 2010, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 4.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 11 November 2010, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.
