#### **Oral Questions and Answers**

#### RULING FROM THE CHAIR

The first main question by the Leader of the Official Opposition may be followed by three supplementary questions. The 3<sup>rd</sup> supplementary question may therefore be asked by any Member of the Official Opposition.

At the request of Mr. President, Mrs. Roy, Second Opposition Group House Leader, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 7 December 2011, on the motion moved by Mrs. Thériault, Minister of Labour, for the passage of Bill 35, An Act to prevent, combat and punish certain fraudulent practices in the construction industry and make other amendments to the Building Act.
