EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bill dissolves the Société de gestion informatique SOGIQUE and transfers its rights and obligations as well as its assets and liabilities to the Minister of Health and Social Services.

The bill also includes provisions concerning the Société's employees.

AN ACT TO DISSOLVE THE SOCIÉTÉ DE GESTION INFORMATIQUE SOGIQUE

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Société de gestion informatique SOGIQUE, constituted on 8 May 1986 by letters patent issued under Part III of the Companies Act (R.S.Q., chapter C-38), is dissolved.

Its rights and obligations as well as its assets and liabilities are transferred to the Minister of Health and Social Services, and its records and other documents become records and documents of that Minister.

2. The Minister of Health and Social Services, or the person designated by the Minister, acts as liquidator of the Société.

3. The term of the members of the board of directors of the Société ends on *(insert the date of coming into force of section 1)*.

4. The regular and casual employees of the Société in office on *(insert the date of introduction of this bill)* and still in office on *(insert the date that occurs one day before the date of coming into force of this section)* respectively become, without further formality, regular and casual employees of the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux. These employees are deemed to have been appointed under the Public Service Act (R.S.Q., chapter F-3.1.1). However, for casual employees of the Société, this applies only for the unexpired portion of their contract.

The Conseil du trésor determines their remuneration, their classification and any other applicable conditions of employment.

5. The Minister of Health and Social Services is responsible for the administration of this Act.

6. The provisions of this Act come into force on the date or dates to be set by the Government.
