Bill 594

An Act to amend the Civil Code with regard to the suspension of extinctive prescription

Introduction

Introduced by Mr. Jean-Martin Aussant Member for Nicolet-Yamaska

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

This bill creates presumptions of impossibility to act for victims of acts of a sexual nature so as to suspend extinctive prescription.

A simple presumption of impossibility to act applies to all victims of acts of a sexual nature. The presumption becomes absolute and irrebuttable if the victim was a minor at the time the acts were committed.

The bill provides that a victim who has already filed a judicial demand and whose demand is still pending may benefit from these presumptions.

If a demand was dismissed on the ground that it was prescribed, the victim has two years to file a new demand and thereby benefit from one or the other of these presumptions.

## Bill 594

# AN ACT TO AMEND THE CIVIL CODE WITH REGARD TO THE SUSPENSION OF EXTINCTIVE PRESCRIPTION

### THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- **1.** The Civil Code of Québec is amended by inserting the following article after article 2904:
- **"2904.1.** If a judicial demand is based on injury caused by an act of a sexual nature, it is presumed that it was impossible for the victim to act until the time the demand is filed.

If the victim was a minor when the act was committed, it is deemed that it was impossible for the victim to act until the time the demand is filed."

- **2.** A victim who filed a judicial demand based on injury caused by an act of a sexual nature before the coming into force of this Act may
- (a) benefit from the presumptions of impossibility to act, if the demand is pending;
- (b) file a new demand within two years after the coming into force of this Act, if the demand was dismissed on the ground that it was prescribed.
- **3.** This Act comes into force on (insert the date of assent to this Act).
