By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, together with Mr. Kotto (Bourget), Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), moved:

THAT, in marking the 35-year career of violinist Angèle Dubeau, the National Assembly underline her important contribution to the broader appreciation of classical music in Québec and internationally.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) moved a motion concerning the Neuville aerodrome; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Business Having Precedence

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been suspended on 28 March 2012, on the motion by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, —That this Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Simard (Richelieu), Mr. Pelletier (Rimouski), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. McKay (L'Assomption), Mrs. Malavoy (Taillon), Mr. Simard (Kamouraska-Témiscouata), Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) and Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), subject to the receivability of these motions.

The debate being concluded, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, declared that the motions stating a grievance were receivable, with the exception of the motion moved by Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean).

On behalf of the Member concerned, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, requested leave of the Assembly to replace the aforementioned motion ruled out of order by a new motion that complies with the Standing Orders. The motion deemed out of order could not be replaced for want of consent.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, then proceeded to put the question on the motions stating a grievance moved during the debate on the Budget Speech.

First, the question was put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2012-2013 budget, which puts all the burden of the fiscal effort to restore fiscal balance on the middle class

A recorded division was thereupon demanded. The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **74** in Appendix)

Yeas: 47 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Simard (Richelieu). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Government for having underestimated government expenditure by \$10.3 billion during the period covered by the Plan to Restore Fiscal Balance, following the method established by the Auditor General in his report entitled "Audit of Financial Information and Other Related Work – Report of the Auditor General of Québec to the National Assembly for 2011-2012", published on 1 March 2012.

(Division No. **75** in Appendix)

Yeas: 47 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was next put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Pelletier (Rimouski). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for the 2012-2013 budget, which fails to respond to the report of the Auditor General of Québec, who considers that the doubtful accounts expense within the framework of tax recovery targets was significantly underestimated.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded. The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **76** in Appendix)

Yeas: 47 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Government for having refused to decommission the Gentilly-2 nuclear generating station and for having set aside \$275 million for its refurbishment in the 2012-2013 budget.

(Division No. 77 in Appendix)

Yeas: 41 Nays: 66 Abstentions: 0

The question was thereafter put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Khadir (Mercier). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government and its 2012-2013 budget for having disregarded public opinion calling for the abolition of the health tax and the cancellation of the \$1625 increase in tuition fees, for having failed to significantly increase public scrutiny and participation in the natural resources sector, and for having failed to lay the foundation for job creation in Québec based on a greener solidarity economy.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded. The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 78 in Appendix)

Yeas: 41 Nays: 66 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its stubbornness in maintaining the health tax, which directly penalizes all Quebecers, particularly the middle class.

(Division No. **79** in Appendix)

Yeas: 47 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition. This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government, which, in tabling its 2012-2013 budget, has failed to fulfil its economic and financial responsibilities by attacking middle-class families and students, while proving its inability to defend Québec's interests in Ottawa.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded. The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 80 in Appendix)

Yeas: 41 Nays: 66 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. McKay (L'Assomption). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for the lack of necessary resources to ensure the ecological planning of the entire territory located north of the 49th parallel and for its failure to commit to the environmental protection of 50 % of this territory.

(Division No. **81** in Appendix)

Yeas: 47 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Malavoy (Taillon). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Government for maintaining its 75 % increase in tuition fees over a five-year period, as well as for its stubbornness in refusing to enter into a dialogue with the students and thus work toward settling the student strike.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded. The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 82 in Appendix)

Yeas: 41 Nays: 66 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Simard (Kamouraska-Témiscouata). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Liberal Government for the lack of measures in the budget to help agricultural producers going through a crisis.

(Division No. 83 in Appendix)

Yeas: 47 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Liberal Government for having cut \$23 million in the investment plan for seniors.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded. The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **84** in Appendix)

Yeas: 47 Nays: 60 Abstentions: 0

Finally, the question was put on the motion moved by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, -That this Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded. The motion was carried on the following vote:

(Division No. **85** in Appendix)

Yeas: 60 Nays: 47 Abstentions: 0

At 1.14 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.04 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved:

THAT the National Assembly urge the Minister of Health to review the current prescription drug insurance plan to introduce a fully public and universal prescription drug insurance that guarantees adequate coverage and equitable access to prescription drugs for all the population of Québec, while increasing the disposable income of citizens.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 20 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion and 10 minutes shall be allotted for his reply; 16 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members; approximately 25 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 42 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

At the end of her address, Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) moved:

THAT the motion by the Member for Mercier be amended as follows: by replacing the words "to introduce a fully public and universal prescription drug insurance that guarantees adequate coverage and" by the words "in order to improve coverage and ensure".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly urge the Minister of Health to review the current prescription drug insurance plan in order to improve coverage and ensure equitable access to prescription drugs for all the population of Québec, while increasing the disposable income of citizens.

The debate continued on the main motion by Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and on the amendment by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), subject to the permission of its author.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier) refused the amendment proposed by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau).

The debate being concluded, the motion was negatived.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved, –That Bill 55, An Act respecting the professional recognition of medical electrophysiology technologists do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 55 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 55 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Health and Social Services.

The motion was carried.
