Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Houda-Pepin (La Pinière), together with Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity and Minister responsible for the Status of Women, Mrs. St-Laurent (Montmorency) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the inauguration of the Québec monument to honour women in politics, erected this very day on the premises of the Parliament Building in recognition of Thérèse Forget Casgrain, Marie-Lacoste Gérin-Lajoie and Idola Saint-Jean, the three suffragettes who for two decades fought to gain the right to vote and eligibility of women, a right that was finally granted to Quebec women by the Premier, Adélard Godbout, on 25 April 1940 and which did not materialize until 21 years later with the election of pioneer Marie-Claire Kirkland, who wrote a page of history by becoming, on 14 December 1961, the first woman elected to the Legislative Assembly of Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Zakaïb, Minister for Industrial Policy and the Banque de développement économique du Québec, together with Mr. Drolet (Jean-Lesage) and Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie), moved:
