Notices of Proceedings in Committees

- the Committee on Public Finance, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 21, An Act to optimize government action in delivering public services to citizens and businesses;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 13, An Act to amend the Election Act with regard to on-campus voting outside a voter's electoral division.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he then convened the following Committee:

— the Committee on Institutions, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 22, An Act to amend the Crime Victims Compensation Act.

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

— the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources shall hold a deliberative meeting to continue drafting its report following the special consultations held at the National Assembly on 29 and 30 January 2013 on the impacts associated with the decommissioning of Gentilly-2 nuclear power station and the economic diversification plan for the Centre-du-Québec and Mauricie sectors;

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Marceau, Minister of Finance and the Economy, informed the Assembly that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor recommended to its consideration Bill 25, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of certain provisions of the Budget Speech of 20 November 2012, and then moved, —That this Bill do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 309, the Assembly held two debates upon adjournment:

— the first, on a question by Mr. Drolet (Jean-Lesage) to Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, about the high concentration of nickel in the air in Limoilou district. Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, replaced the Minister of Health and Social Services for this debate;

— the second, on a question by Mr. Arcand (Mont-Royal) to Mr. Lisée, Minister responsible for the Montréal region, about the Autorité des marchés financiers audit delays in relation to City of Montréal contracts. Mr. Bédard, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, replaced the Minister responsible for the Montréal region for this debate.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 308, the debate upon adjournment scheduled to be held between Mr. D'Amour (Rivière-du-Loup-Témiscouata) and Mrs. Ouellet, Minister of Natural Resources, about the uncertainty in the mining industry, was deferred until Tuesday, 26 March 2013.

At 1.28 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.
