# **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

Pursuant to the consent given at the sitting of 25 April 2013, the Assembly held the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Duchesneau (Saint-Jérôme).

By leave of the Assembly, the wording of the motion, moved together with Mr. Lisée, Minister of International Relations, La Francophonie and External Trade, Mrs. St-Pierre (Acadie) and Mrs. David (Gouin), was modified and reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the historic character and significant impact of the presence of the International Civil Aviation Organization in Montréal, both from an economic perspective as well as in terms of international relations;

THAT it ask the Government of Québec and all other stakeholders to work together and make every effort to keep this important international organization in Montréal.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Hivon, Minister for Social Services and Youth Protection, together with Mrs. Vallée (Gatineau), Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly denounce the intention expressed by the Federal Government, within the framework of the last budget, to unilaterally modify the Homelessness Partnership Strategy to only support the "housing first" approach, which would have the serious consequence of denying funding to numerous and important homelessness projects that meet various needs and situations;

THAT it demand that the Federal Government renew the Homelessness Partnership Strategy in its current form, namely by respecting Québec's policy directions regarding homelessness.

The question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mr. Lisée, Minister of International Relations, La Francophonie and External Trade, Mrs. St-Pierre (Acadie) and Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie), moved:

THAT the National Assembly express its condolences and sympathy to the families and loved ones of the workers who died or were injured in the collapse, on Wednesday, 24 April, of a building housing 3000 textile workers in Savar, Bangladesh;

THAT it express its sympathy to the Quebecers originally from this country and who have suffered greatly in the wake of this disaster;

THAT the National Assembly encourage businesses to adhere to responsible work practices aiming to ensure the dignity and safety of workers;

THAT the National Assembly encourage the population of Québec to make certain that the products made in foreign countries come from businesses that respect basic human rights including that of working in a safe environment.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the invitation of Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, together with Mrs. Vallières (Richmond), Mr. Lévesque (Vanier-Les Rivières) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Volunteer Week to recognize the contribution of volunteers and organizations from all regions of Québec and in so doing express well-deserved gratitude to them.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

THAT the Committee on Public Finance analyze the impacts that the budget cuts arising from the Québec Government's timeframe to return to a balanced budget will have on Québec's economy and on the citizens of Québec;

THAT for this purpose the Committee promptly hold a general consultation;

THAT the organization of the mandate be entrusted to the Committee;

THAT the Minister of Finance be a member of the Committee during its proceedings;

THAT the Committee table its report in the Assembly no later than 3 December 2013;

THAT this motion become an order of the Assembly.
