The Assembly was called to order at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

Deferred Divisions

THAT for this purpose the Committee promptly hold a general consultation;

THAT the organization of the mandate be entrusted to the Committee;

THAT the Minister of Finance be a member of the Committee during its proceedings;

THAT the Committee table its report in the Assembly no later than 3 December 2013;

THAT this motion become an order of the Assembly

Motions Without Notice

THAT it applaud the quality of the work carried out by these professionals who, day after day, provide quality health care to persons suffering from illnesses.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Pursuant to Standing Order 129, Mr. Lessard, Chief Opposition Whip, moved:

THAT the Member for Jean-Lesage be appointed a permanent member of the Committee on Public Administration in substitution for the Member for Laporte;

THAT the Member for Laporte be appointed a permanent member of the Committee on Public Finance in substitution for the Member for Jean-Lesage;

THAT the Member for Mont-Royal be appointed a permanent member of the Committee on Transportation and the Environment in substitution for the Member for Pontiac;

THAT these modifications enter into effect immediately.

The motion was carried.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 298, Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that the interpellation scheduled for Friday, 3 May 2013, between Mr. Bachand (Outremont) and Mr. Marceau, Minister of Finance and the Economy, on "assessing the consequences of the reduction in State revenues under the Parti Québécois Government" will be held on Monday, 6 May 2013, from 2.00 o'clock p.m. to 4.00 o'clock p.m.

Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, then informed the Assembly that on Friday, 10 May 2013, Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon) would question Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services and Minister responsible for Seniors, during an interpellation on "the autonomy insurance project of the Minister of Health and Social Services and responsible for Seniors".

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 12, An Act to amend the Police Act as concerns independent investigations.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 1 May 2013, on the motion by Mrs. De Courcy, Minister responsible for the Charter of the French language, for the passage in principle of Bill 14, An Act to amend the Charter of the French language, the Charter of human rights and freedoms and other legislative provisions.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion by Mrs. De Courcy, Minister responsible for the Charter of the French language, for the passage in principle of Bill 14, An Act to amend the Charter of the French language, the Charter of human rights and freedoms and other legislative provisions.

At the request of Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, Mrs. Vallières (Richmond) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

The debate continued.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mrs. Charlebois (Soulanges).

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held three debates upon adjournment:

- the first, on a question by Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon) to Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, about the permission that is about to be granted to sell alcohol in gaming areas; Mr. Marceau, Minister of Finance and the Economy, replaced the Minister of Health and Social Services for this debate;
- the second, on a question by Mrs. Thériault (Anjou-Louis-Riel) to Mrs. De Courcy, Minister of Immigration and Cultural Communities, about a conflict of interests involving one of the Minister's political attachés;
- the third, on a question by Mrs. Blais (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne) to Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services and Minister responsible for Seniors, about the lack of home care resources.

At 6.38 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 7 May 2013, at 1.45 o'clock p.m.
