Motions Without Notice

The new organization, dedicated to international cooperation, is intended to volunteer the professional services of public accountants in their recognized areas of specialization to NGOs and organizations serving populations in need. This administrative and accounting support aims at achieving sustainable development in the field and is a complement to the local resources which will remain at the centre of all interventions.

THAT the presentation by the Minister of Health and Social Services last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 90 minutes;

THAT the presentation by the director general of the CHUM last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 90 minutes;

THAT the presentation by each of the other speakers, if any, last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 50 minutes;

THAT the Committee report to the Assembly no later than 14 June 2013, unless the Committee decides otherwise;

Lastly, that this motion become an order of the Assembly.

Government Bills

Report Stage

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held three debates upon adjournment:

- the first, on a question by Mrs. Thériault (Anjou-Louis-Riel) to Mr. Marceau, Minister of Finance and the Economy, about "the absence of the Investissement Québec delegate in Munich following the appointment of Jean-Yves Duthel while awaiting his trial that has been deferred until next September". Mr. Bédard, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, replaced the Minister of Finance and the Economy for this debate;
- the second, on a question by Mrs. St-Amand (Trois-Rivières) to Mrs. Léger, Minister of Families, about "the Parti Québécois Government's inaction with regard to the first day of striking scheduled to take place in the 650 day care services and affecting over 41,250 children";

At the request of Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, Mrs. St-Amand (Trois-Rivières) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

— the third, on a question by Mrs. Rotiroti (Jeanne-Mance-Viger) to Mrs. De Courcy, Minister of Immigration and Cultural Communities, about "the National Assembly's examination of Bill 394, An Act to amend the Act respecting immigration to Québec and other legislative provisions in order to facilitate the integration of immigrants into the labour market".
