(20) Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) – **5 November 2013** To the Minister of Labour:

> In Québec, when a business is sold, its occupational health and safety file is transferred to the new buyer, even if the new buyer is operating under a new business name and Québec business number and even if the former owner continues to operate a similar business under the former business name and former Québec business number.

Can the Minister of Labour explain to us why the accident files of the Commission de la santé et de la sécurité du travail are processed in this manner, which may lead to taking responsibility away from actual offenders and harming the interests of new buyers?

# Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) – 5 November 2013To the Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy:

Under Québec law, tenants who comply with all of the conditions of their lease can stay in their dwelling as long as they wish. This is known as the right to maintain occupancy. There are, however, exceptions to this rule, and repossessing a dwelling is one of them. A landlord who is the owner of an immovable can retake possession of a dwelling in the immovable. A co-owner of an immovable held in undivided co-ownership can also repossess a dwelling on the condition that there is only one other co-owner who is his or her spouse. For example, a brother and sister who are co-owners cannot repossess a dwelling.

Can the Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy explain to us the grounds on which this provision is based and which prevents two coowning members of the same immediate family from repossessing a dwelling for one or the other's personal use in an immovable that belongs to them?
