Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations

Mr. President informed the Assembly that he had received, within the prescribed time, a request from Mr. Bergeron (Verchères) to rise on a matter of personal explanations. The request concerns comments made by the Minister of Public Security in the House on 3 June 2014, when during Question Period, she referred to a visit that the Member for Verchères allegedly made to the offices of the Anti-Corruption Unit (UPAC) when he was Minister of Public Security.

The Member is of the opinion that the comments made about him are not accurate and that they impugn his reputation. Parliamentary jurisprudence has recognized that a Member cannot invoke a matter of personal explanations because he considers that certain comments made about him during parliamentary debates are insulting, deceptive or offensive. The Chair has already recalled that the Member who considers that comments made about him are insulting or offensive must immediately avail himself of the provisions of Standing Order 35, which was done by the Official Opposition House Leader and regarding which the Chair gave explanations on 3 June 2014.

Furthermore, the comments in question refer to the situation of the Member for Verchères when he held the office of minister. It is customary for personal explanations to be a means at the disposal of any Member who wants to rectify a situation that concerns him as a Member of the Assembly and not as a minister.

Accordingly, Mr. President deemed the request to be inadmissible.
