- (1) Pursuant to Standing Orders 275 and 276, continuation of the debate on the motion by the Minister of Finance, - That this Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government,

And on the motions stating a grievance moved by:

The Member for Rousseau:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for having presented an outrageous financial framework in the last election campaign.

The Member for Lévis:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for the lack of ambitious economic recovery and tax relief measures for families and the middle class in its 2014-2015 budget.

The Member for Gouin:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for the overly hasty return to a balanced budget in its 2014-2015 budget, for the permanent austerity that will have a negative impact on quality and accessibility of public services, and for the under-financing and the general hiring freeze in the public and parapublic sectors.

The Member for Saint-Jean:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for having presented the 2014-2015 Liberal-Coalition Avenir Québec budget, which foresees a decline in job creation in Québec.

The Member for Marie-Victorin:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for having presented the 2014-2015 Liberal-Coalition Avenir Québec budget, which relaunches the shale gas industry in the St. Lawrence Valley.

The Member for Sanguinet:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for having presented the 2014-2015 Liberal-Coalition Avenir Québec budget, which abandons the Putting Jobs First economic policy.

The Member for Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its 2014-2015 budget, which fails to initiate Québec's economic transition; limits its actions to support private and traditionally male-dominated economic sectors; does not significantly support the social economy; and directly attacks the education, health and social services networks representing the public economy.

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for having presented the 2014-2015 Liberal-Coalition Avenir Québec budget, which dismantles Québec's offices abroad.

The Member for Verchères:
