At the request of Mr. President, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Deltell (Chauveau), together with Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Government mandate the Auditor General, in the context of his performance audit, to elucidate Hydro-Québec's sale of Gentilly-2 equipment to a scrap metal dealer.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Couillard, Premier, together with Mr. Bédard, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the 70th anniversary of the signing of the Chicago Convention, which led to the International Civil Aviation Organization being founded on 7 December 1944;

THAT it recognize the positive spin-offs associated with ICAO's presence in Montréal and its valuable contribution to the healthy development of international civil aviation.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bédard, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Couillard, Premier, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec pay tribute to Mr. Jean Béliveau, one of the greatest centre players in the history of professional hockey and one of the best of his generation;

THAT it recognize the passing of a legend, who made an enormous contribution to the development of sports and to Québec society;

THAT it also underline his excellence as a player—he was instrumental in winning the Stanley Cup with the Montreal Canadiens ten times from 1956 to 1971—and his many professional achievement awards;

THAT it recall that Mr. Béliveau is a Grand Officer of the Ordre national du Québec and a Companion of the Order of Canada and that he holds numerous honorary doctorates from universities across Canada:

THAT it convey its condolences to his family, friends, colleagues and many admirers throughout Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the invitation of Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

# **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 10, An Act to modify the organization and governance of the health and social services network, in particular by abolishing the regional agencies;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to hear the interested parties and give clause-by-clause consideration to the following private bills, in the order indicated hereafter: Bill 200, An Act respecting Municipalité de Lac-Simon; Bill 201, An Act respecting Ville de Westmount; and Bill 202, An Act respecting the Régie intermunicipale de valorisation des matières organiques de Beauharnois-Salaberry et de Roussillon;
- the Committee on Culture and Education, to hear the interested parties and give clause-by-clause consideration to Private Bill 203, An Act respecting the sale of an immovable situated on the La Grave heritage site.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss a proposed order of initiative on farmland grabbing; and to make an assessment of the hearing examining the policy directions, activities and administrative management of the Commission de protection du territoire agricole du Québec.

#### **Government Bills**

### Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 15, An Act respecting workforce management and control within government departments, public sector bodies and networks and state-owned enterprises.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in on division.

## Passage

Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moved the passage of Bill 3, An Act to foster the financial health and sustainability of municipal defined benefit pension plans.

A debate arose thereon.

During the debate, Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moved that Bill 3 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for the consideration of an amendment that he specified.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly then resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The motion was carried.

#### Committee of the Whole

The amendment to Bill 3 by Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, was considered in Committee of the Whole.

The Committee of the Whole continued its consideration of the amendment to Bill 3 by Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy.

The amendment was carried.

Bill 3, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the Committee's report on division.

The debate continued on the motion for the passage of Bill 3.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 23, An Act to amend the Charter of Ville de Montréal as concerns the composition of the executive committee.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 11, An Act respecting the Société du Plan Nord.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 21, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of agreements on labour matters between the Gouvernement du Québec and the Mohawk Council of Kahnawake.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 21, the proceedings continued beyond 6.00 o'clock p.m.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.
