Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

38 An Act to allow the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec to carry out infrastructure projects

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 38 was introduced in the Assembly.

Mr. Bergeron (Verchères) moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

398 An Act to amend the Act respecting the conditions of employment and the pension plan of the Members of the National Assembly

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 398 was introduced in the Assembly.

Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes) moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

490 An Act to amend the Act respecting the conditions of employment and the pension plan of the Members of the National Assembly as regards the transition allowance

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 490 was introduced in the Assembly.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques) moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

399 An Act to exclude child support payments from income calculation under various social laws

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection and Public Health, tabled the following:

A copy of a letter, dated 17 March 2015, to Mr. Steven Blaney, federal Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, Mr. Peter Gordon MacKay, federal Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, and Mr. Denis Lebel, federal Minister of Infrastructure, Communities and Intergovernmental Affairs, by Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, together with Mrs. Lise Thériault, Deputy Premier and Minister of Public Security, about Bill C-51.

#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the 17 March 2015 sitting, on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, that Bill 28, An Act mainly to implement certain provisions of the Budget Speech of 4 June 2014 and return to a balanced budget in 2015–2016, do now pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 61 Nays: 49 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 28 was passed in principle.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 28 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Public Finance.

The motion was carried.

# **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Lisée (Rosemont), together with Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved a motion concerning Québec's policy directions regarding homelessness; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), moved a motion concerning the Members' conditions of employment and pension plan; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Kelley, Minister responsible for Native Affairs, together with Mr. Leclair (Beauharnois), Mr. Lemay (Masson) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 30th anniversary of a resolution passed by the Assembly, recognizing the Aboriginal nations and their rights;

THAT it reaffirm that this recognition of the Aboriginal nations, and its underlying principles, continues to constitute the basis for government action where the Aboriginal peoples are concerned and shows that a nation-to-nation relationship is being respected.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères) and Mr. Paradis (Lévis), moved a motion to instruct the Committee on Health and Social Services to undertake a mandate concerning the CHUM; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 34, An Act to amend the Supplemental Pension Plans Act with respect to the funding and restructuring of certain multi-employer pension plans;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue the public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 20, An Act to enact the Act to promote access to family medicine and specialized medicine services and to amend various legislative provisions relating to assisted procreation.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to prepare the hearing on the administrative management of the Régie des alcools, des courses et des jeux, in particular based on its 2013–2014 annual management report; then, hold a public meeting to hear the Régie des alcools, des courses et des jeux; and finally, hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the observations, conclusions and recommendations, if any, following this hearing.

# **ORDERS OF THE DAY**

## **Government Bills**

#### Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 26, An Act to ensure mainly the recovery of amounts obtained as a result of fraud or fraudulent tactics in connection with public contracts.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

#### Passage in Principle

Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, moved that Bill 33, An Act to amend the Courts of Justice Act, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 33 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 33 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Institutions.

The motion was carried.

## Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 19, An Act to amend the Cooperatives Act and other legislative provisions.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

At 12.20 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.05 o'clock p.m.

#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mr. Deltell (Chauveau) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall the promise made by the Quebec Liberal Party on 10 February 2014 to limit the increase in electricity rates to the rate of inflation;

THAT it acknowledge that the 2.9% increase in the electricity rate applicable as of 1 April 2015 represents nearly twice the inflation rate;

THAT it note that Hydro-Québec and Régie de l'énergie senior management maintain that the increase in electricity rates is, to a large extent, the result of political decisions concerning wind power;

THAT it reaffirm the importance of a government's honouring its commitments, and ask the Government to refrain from raising electricity rates by more than the rate of inflation until the end of its current mandate. Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 52 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 22 minutes to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) moved:

THAT the motion by the Member for Chauveau be amended as follows:

By adding, at the end of the third paragraph, the words "resulting from certain poorly defined calls for tenders under the Liberal Government".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall the promise made by the Quebec Liberal Party on 10 February 2014 to limit the increase in electricity rates to the rate of inflation;

THAT it acknowledge that the 2.9% increase in the electricity rate applicable as of 1 April 2015 represents nearly twice the inflation rate;

THAT it note that Hydro-Québec and Régie de l'énergie senior management maintain that the increase in electricity rates is, to a large extent, the result of political decisions concerning wind power resulting from certain poorly defined calls for tenders under the Liberal Government; THAT it reaffirm the importance of a government's honouring its commitments, and ask the Government to refrain from raising electricity rates by more than the rate of inflation until the end of its current mandate.

The debate continued on the main motion by Mr. Deltell (Chauveau) and on the amendment motion by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Deltell (Chauveau) refused the amendment proposed by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

# **Government Bills**

#### Passage

Mr. Coiteux, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Ongoing Program Review and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the passage of Bill 30, An Act respecting mainly the suspension of payment of bonuses in the context of budgetbalancing measures.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 30 was passed.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 19 March 2015, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 5.11 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 19 March 2015, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.
