While strolling through our seven thematic gardens, you will discover dozens of varieties of organically-grown herbs, vegetables, fruits and berries, medicinal plants, tropical and fruit trees, and flowers in in-ground and raised beds and containers.

New this year: Extend your experience to Le Parlementaire restaurant where you can savour dishes prepared for you by our three chefs, using fresh produce selected weekly from the gardens.

For the third year, picking is allowed in four sections of the vegetable garden beds. Look for the signs to help you locate them easily. Help yourself in moderation, leaving some for other visitors. Your cooperation will make all the difference!




