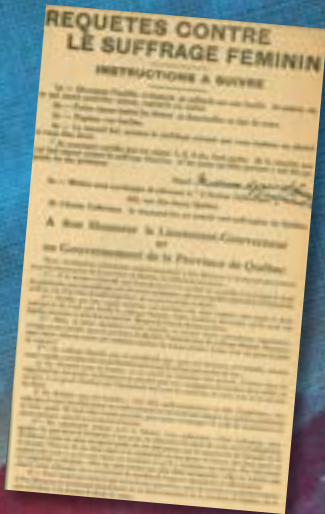

This exhibition invites us to delve into the unique world of MNAs and discover the principal roles exercised by Québec elected representatives throughout time.

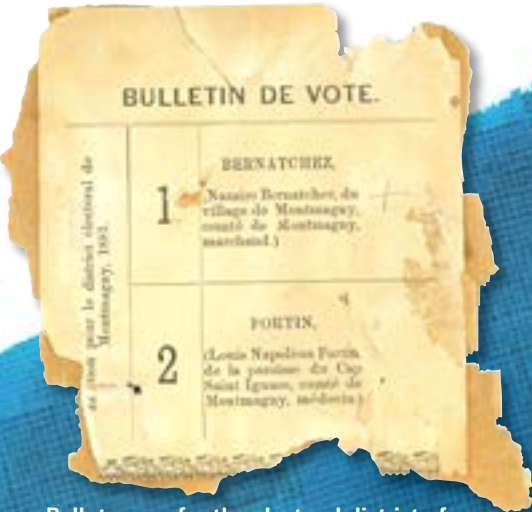
Get acquainted with the story of the women and men who have shaped Québec's political history.

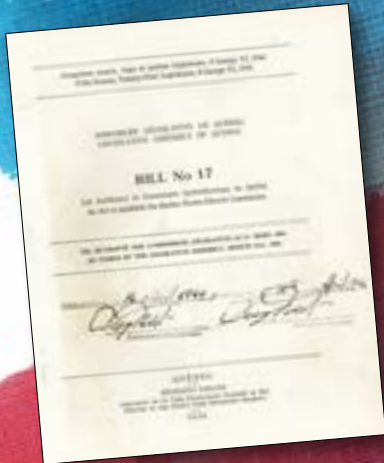

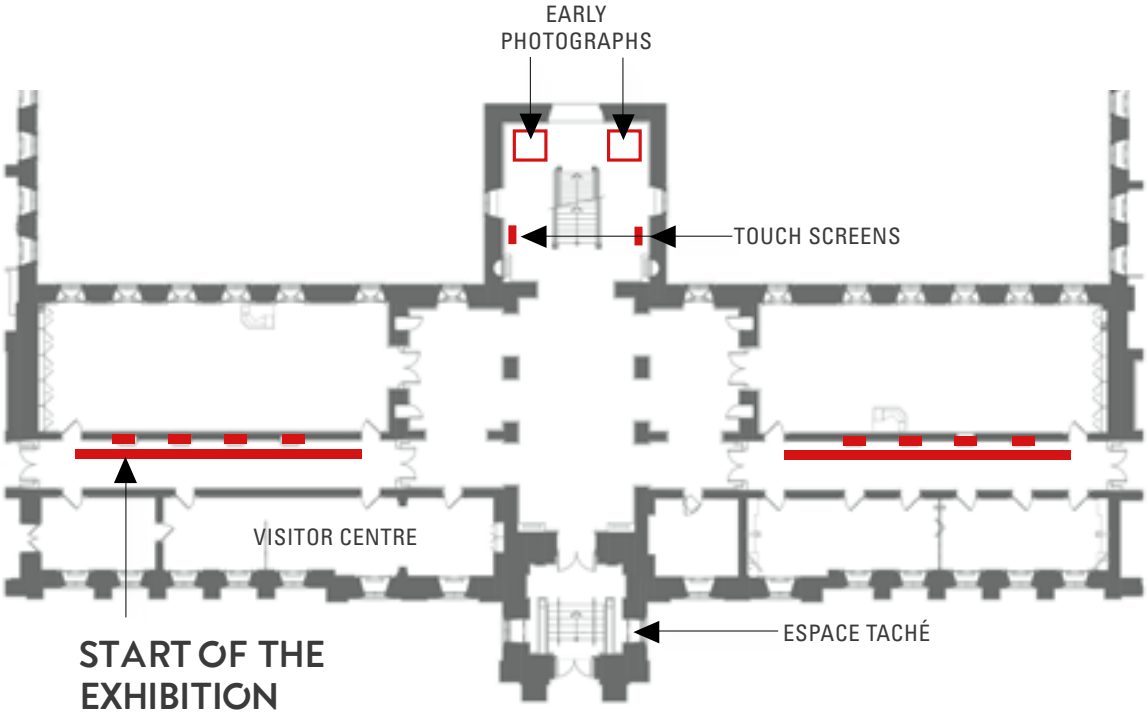


Assented-to copy of Bill 17, *An Act to establish the Quebec Hydro-Electric Commission* (Hydro-Québec), 1944.
