Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 (3) and 185, Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, Mr. Deltell (Chauveau) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) jointly moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 35-year artistic career of Georges Hamel , well-known singer and well loved by country music fans, his outstanding contribution on Québec's music scene, and that it pay tribute to his involvement in the Société de gestion collective de l'Union des artistes (ARTISTI) for the defense and promotion of the rights of performers.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved, —That Bill 43, Tobacco-related Damages and Health Care Costs Recovery Act, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 43 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mrs. Beauchamp, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 43 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Social Affairs.

The motion was carried.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Social Affairs on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 47, An Act to amend the Act to ratify the Agreement concerning the building and operating of a hospital centre in the Kahnawake Territory.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage

Mrs. Beauchamp, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks, moved the passage of Bill 27, An Act to affirm the collective nature of water resources and provide for increased water resource protection.

A debate arose thereon.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion by Mrs. Beauchamp, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks, for the passage of Bill 27, An Act to affirm the collective nature of water resources and provide for increased water resource protection.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 27 was passed.

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Beauchamp, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks, moved, —That Bill 28, An Act respecting the boundaries of the waters in the domain of the State and the protection of wetlands along part of the Richelieu River, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 28 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 28 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Transportation and the Environment.

The motion was carried.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Social Affairs on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 49, An Act respecting the representation of family-type resources and certain intermediate resources and the negotiation process for their group agreements, and amending various legislative provisions.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage

Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, moved the passage of Bill 10, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 10 was passed.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 21 and 52, Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Friday, 12 June 2009, at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
