#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 9 June 2009, on the motion moved by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, for the passage in principle of Bill 40, An Act to amend the Balanced Budget Act and various legislative provisions concerning the implementation of the accounting reform.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage

Mrs. Boulet, Minister of Transport, moved the passage of Bill 5, An Act to amend the Act respecting transportation services by taxi.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 5 was passed.

# **Debates on Reports from Committees**

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Administration, which, in pursuance of the *Public Administration Act*, heard: on 17 September 2008, the Deputy Minister of Revenu Québec and the President of the Société de développement des entreprises culturelles, concerning financial support to cultural agencies; on 1 October 2008, the Deputy Minister of Health and Social Services, concerning the provision of medical equipment and supplies; on 29 and 30 October 2008, the Auditor General of Québec, the Secretary General of the Ministère du Conseil exécutif, and the former Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, concerning the special report of the Auditor General of Québec to the National Assembly regarding the use of public funds by the former Lieutenant-Governor of Québec. The Committee also held deliberative meetings on 17 September 2008, on 1, 29 and 30 October 2008, on 12 and 31 March 2009, and on 8 April 2009 with reference to this mandate. The report contains 17 recommendations.

Pursuant to that which had been decided upon the adoption of the parliamentary reform, on 21 April 2009, concerning the allocation of speaking time for limited debates, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the discussion of this motion: 5 minutes shall be set aside for the independent Member; a fixed portion amounting to 10 % of the total time allotted for this debate shall be set aside for the Members of the Second Opposition Group; the remaining time shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; within this framework, any time not used by the independent Member or by the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa; and individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

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At 12.52 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 32 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mrs. Normandeau, Deputy Premier, moved that Bill 32 be referred for clause-byclause consideration to the Committee on Culture.

The motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 21 and 52, Mrs. Normandeau, Deputy Premier, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 11 June 2009, at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 5.07 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 11 June 2009, at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
