#### **Government Bills**

Passage

Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, moved the passage of Bill 11, An Act to amend the Acts establishing Capital régional et coopératif Desjardins, Fondaction and the Fonds de solidarité des travailleurs du Québec (F.T.Q.).

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 11 was passed.
