By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143.1, Mrs. Beauchamp, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

 the Committee on Public Finance, to conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on the results of the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec;

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Whissell, Minister of Labour, moved the passage of Bill 25, An Act to amend the Pay Equity Act.

A debate arose thereon.

During the debate, Mr. Whissell, Minister of Labour, moved that Bill 25 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for the consideration of two amendments that he specified.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Whissell, Minister of Labour, moved that the Assembly then resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The motion was carried.

The amendments by Mr. Whissell, Minister of Labour, to Bill 25 were considered and then carried in Committee of the Whole.

Bill 25, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the Committee's report.

The debate continued on the motion for the passage of Bill 25, An Act to amend the Pay Equity Act.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.05 o'clock p.m.

Passage

The debate continued on the motion by Mr. Whissell, Minister of Labour, for the passage of Bill 25, An Act to amend the Pay Equity Act.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Whissell, Minister of Labour, moved, —That Bill 35, An Act to modify the occupational health and safety regime, particularly in order to increase certain death benefits and fines and simplify the payment of the employer assessment, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

During his address, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Rebello (La Prairie) tabled the following:
