Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 298, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that the interpellation scheduled for Friday, 15 May 2009, between Mr. St-Arnaud (Chambly) and Mr. Dupuis, Minister of Public Security, on "the state of correctional services in Québec", will be held exceptionally from 9.00 o'clock a.m. to 11.00 o'clock a.m.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Hamad, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, moved, —That Bill 22, An Act respecting the governance of the Régie des rentes du Québec and amending various legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 22 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 22 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Social Affairs.

The motion was carried.
